SUBJECT: Federal Workforce Innovation Funding Recommendations for Operations of the Linking Innovation Knowledge & Employment Project

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Approve \$1,451,775 in Workforce Innovation Fund (WIF) funding for California Family Life Center (CFLC) and Arbor Education & Training, LLC DBA ResCare Workforce Services (Arbor); and
- 2. Authorize the Assistant County Executive Officer/EDA or designee to execute a three year agreement with CFLC and Arbor, subject to approval as to form by County Counsel.

BACKGROUND: On July 17, 2012, the Riverside County Board Of Supervisors accepted the \$6,000,000 Federal Workforce Innovation Fund Grant. The Riverside County Economic Development Agency (EDA) - Workforce Development Division is the lead agency for the Linking Innovation, Knowledge and Employment (@Like) project.

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## **BACKGROUND:** (Continued)

The Project covers the Counties of Riverside, San Bernardino, and Imperial. The @LIKE project will serve 675 disconnected young adults, age 18 to 24, who are unemployed and not attending school and are either low-income, gang-involved, an ex-offender, on aid or a veteran.

In Riverside County the project will serve 277 disconnected young adults through three of the Riverside County Youth Opportunity Centers located in Hemet, Rubidoux and Indio. The Hemet and Rubidoux Youth Opportunity Centers are operated by CFLC and the Indio Youth Opportunity Center is operated by Arbor.

CFLC and Arbor will partner with Smooth Transition, Inc., Riverside Community College, Mt. San Jacinto College, College of the Desert, Riverside County Office of Education, Coachella Valley Economic Partnership, Small Business Development Center, Road Trip Nation, and the Coachella Valley Women's Business Center to deliver the services outlined in the grant. These organizations were included in the grant as partners.

Riverside County EDA has budgeted a total \$1,451,775 to be allocated to CFLC and Arbor. Arbor and CFLC will enter in to sub-agreements with the partnering agencies listed above. The final project designs with the partnering agencies will be developed during the 4 month implementation phase. It is anticipated that approximately two thirds of the funding will be allocated to CFLC and approximately one third of the funding will be allocated to Arbor as described in the table below. Riverside County EDA may adjust the funding amounts between CFLC and Arbor based on final project design; however, funding will not exceed \$1,451,775.

The period of performance for the grant is July 1, 2012 through October 31, 2016.
