BACKGROUND:

On March 22, 2011, Sierra Landscape stopped its performance of the Romoland Beautification Phase IB Interchange Contract. On August 16, 2011, the Board approved a Notice of Cessation for that contract putting their surety company Great American on notice that they would be responsible for the completion of the contract. Given the delay by the Surety in moving this project forward to completion, the Redevelopment Agency obtained a cost quote from the EDA/Community Services Division maintenance team to complete the work. The Surety was notified of this cost and agreed to have the EDA/Community Services Division complete the work. The remaining work has now been completed and Caltrans has accepted the work as complete. At this time there is an unknown remaining contract balance in the construction retention escrow account, which will not exceed \$39,000, that is currently owed to Great American per their Indemnity Agreement with the defaulting contractor.

Staff recommends that the Board approve these motions so that Great American can be paid these funds.
