On motion of Supervisor Benoit, seconded by Supervisor Tavaglione, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, August 28, 2012, is adjourned in memory of Chief Warrant Officer Suresh Krause, a 29-year-old resident of Cathedral City and one of seven U.S. service members who died with honor on August 16, 2012, when their Black Hawk helicopter went down near Kandahar Province in Afghanistan.

Assigned to the 2nd Battalion, 25th Aviation Regiment, 25th Combat Aviation Brigade, 25th Infantry Division, at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, Suresh was a decorated service member who joined the Army in 2007 and became a Black Hawk pilot two years later. While serving our Country during his second deployment, he was killed four years into a 10-year enlistment.

A loving son and friend, Suresh will always be remembered as a "kind and brilliant hero" who has dreamed of flying since he was 14 years old. His memory and selfless spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be greatly missed.
