BACKGROUND: JAG was created by President Bush to replace two previous grants, the Edward Byrne Memorial Formula Grant and the Local Law Enforcement Block Grant. Jurisdictions are awarded a specific allocation based upon a formula that incorporates population information and reports of Part 1 crimes reported to the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

This year, because the amount allocated to the cities in the County totals more than 4 times what the county is receiving, a single application on behalf of the county and all cities (contract and non-contract) must be submitted. On April 11, 2012, representatives for the County and the City of Riverside met to discuss who would assume the duties and responsibilities as the Fiscal Agent. The City of Riverside agreed to be the Fiscal Agent. All applicants for the FY 12 Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program are required to submit a grant application to the City of Riverside. Riverside County's 2012 allocation is \$86,476.50. The Sheriff's Department share of the funding is \$43,239. No budget adjustments are necessary.

The grant project and budget period is from 10/01/11 through 09/30/15. County program funds will be used to continue the support of a Fugitive Warrant Extradition Sergeant and provide support to the District Attorney's Office and the Probation Department. The District Attorney's Office and Probation Department will make their own budget adjustments if necessary.
