# DECLARING THE EXISTENCE OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY UNDER GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 8630 AND COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 533.5

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 8630 authorizes the Board of Supervisors to proclaim the existence of a "local emergency", and

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 8558(c) defines a "local emergency" to include "conditions of disaster of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the territorial limits of a county, city and county, or city, caused by such conditions as air pollution, fire, flood, storm, epidemic, riot, drought, sudden and severe energy shortage, plant or animal infestation or disease, the Governor's warning of an earthquake, or volcanic prediction, or an earthquake or other condition, other than conditions resulting from a labor controversy, which conditions are likely to be beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment and facilities of that political subdivision and require the combined forces of other political subdivisions to combat"; and

WHEREAS, conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property have arisen within this County caused by substantial amounts of continuous rain fall resulting in subsequent flooding in Riverside County; and

WHEREAS, the conditions described above were beyond the capabilities and control of the services, personnel, equipment and facilities of the County and required the combined forces of other political subdivisions; now therefore;

BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED, ORDERED AND DECLARED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California, in regular session assembled on **September 25, 2012**, that an emergency continues to exist within said County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED that during the existence of said emergency, powers, functions, and duties of the Director of Emergency Services and the Emergency Management Organization of Riverside County shall be those

prescribed by State law and the ordinances, resolutions, and approved plans of the County of Riverside in order to mitigate the effects of said emergency.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED DETERMINED AND ORDERED that all County officials and employees cooperate and coordinate efforts with officials and employees of other political subdivisions and officials and employees of the state and federal government in bringing the present condition of local emergency and disaster under control.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED that within the next fourteen (14) days a report on the most recent conditions of emergency and disaster be presented to this Board of Supervisors so that this Board may determine whether conditions of emergency and disaster still exist.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED that Peter Lent,
Deputy Director of the Riverside County Fire Department, Office of Emergency Services is
hereby designated as the authorized representative of the County of Riverside for the purpose
of receipt, processing and coordination of all inquiries and requirements necessary to obtain
available state and federal assistance.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED that a copy of this resolution is forwarded to CalEMA with the request that the Governor of California proclaim the existence of a State of Emergency throughout Riverside County and further request a Presidential Declaration.

## COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

## PROCLAMATION OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY BY THE DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 533.5 of the County of Riverside empowers the Director of Emergency Services to proclaim the existence or threatened existence of a "Local Emergency" when the Board of Supervisors is not in session; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Emergency Services finds:

That at the time of this proclamation the Board of Supervisors is not in session; and,

That conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property have arisen within the Eastern portion of the County of Riverside, caused by a record-breaking rainfall which created subsequent severe flooding and road closures; and,

There exists an imminent threat to life and property; and,

Communities affected are within the unincorporated areas of the County of Riverside; and,

That the aforementioned conditions of extreme peril warrant and necessitate the proclamation of a "Local Emergency".

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED that a "Local Emergency" now exists within the County of Riverside; and,

IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that during the existence of said "Local Emergency" the powers, functions and duties of the Director of Emergency Services and the Emergency Management Organization of this County shall be those prescribed by State law and the charter, ordinances, resolutions and approved plans of the County of Riverside in order to mitigate the effects of said "Local Emergency"; and,

IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that said "Local Emergency" shall be deemed to continue to exist for the next seven (7) days, and thereafter by ratification of the Board of Supervisors, until its termination is proclaimed by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, and;

IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that a copy of this proclamation be forwarded to the Governor of California with the request that he proclaim the existence of a State of Emergency throughout Riverside County and that the Governor request a Presidential Declaration.
