BACKGROUND CONTINUED:

One of the Federal and State outcome measures requires counties to increase the number of adoptions completed within 24 months of removal from the home. Of all the children adopted in Riverside County, 43.9% were adopted within 24 months, which is above the state average of 34.9%.

Despite our efforts to ensure that children do not linger in foster care and receive families whom they may call their own, there are still children in foster care awaiting permanent adoptive homes.

Currently, in Riverside County there are 89 children awaiting permanent adoptive homes.

This proclamation serves to commend Riverside County adoptive parents for their significant contributions to strengthening and improving our families and communities. It also serves to provide awareness for children still awaiting permanent adoptive homes and the need to continue efforts to decrease the number of children waiting to be adopted.
