RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Approve the single source with Desert AIDS Project to provide HIV testing services in nonhealthcare settings and linkage to care not to exceed \$30,000 for period of November 1, 2012 to June 30, 2013 in accordance to Ordinance 459.4;
- 2. Authorize the County Purchasing Agent, in accordance with Ordinance No. 459, to execute the agreement with Desert AIDS Project and to exercise the renewal option for a maximum of four additional years, renewable annually, in the estimated amount of \$40,000 annually, based on the availability grant funding, and to sign amendments that do not change the substantive terms of the agreement, including amendments to compensation provision that do not exceed contract rate listed in the agreement and this Form 11.

BACKGROUND

In support of the National HIV/AIDS Strategy, the California Department of Public Health Office of AIDS (OA) is placing greater emphasis on identifying individuals unaware of their HIV status and on linking newly diagnosed individuals to HIV care and treatment as soon as possible. The Office of AIDS has identified several strategies to address this change in their prevention focus, including targeted HIV testing at non-healthcare settings, routinizing HIV testing in healthcare settings, enhanced Partner Services, and timely linkages to care. These newly emphasized activities are designed to increase the effectiveness of HIV testing activities to identify HIV infected individuals and get them linked with care and treatment services with the goal of reducing the spread of HIV and increasing the quality of life of HIV infected individuals.

To support these goals, the County of Riverside Department of Public Health, HIV/STD Branch sought proposals to implement new and innovative strategies for targeted HIV testing at non-healthcare settings to reach unaware and high-risk individuals in Eastern Riverside County.

Agencies funded under this grant will provide confidential HIV testing to individuals in Eastern Riverside County. Testing services may include: assessment of client needs regarding HIV transmission; client-focused prevention counseling, where appropriate; risk-reduction planning; and referral to other services.

PRICE REASONABLENESS

Riverside County Purchasing released a Request for Proposal (RFP#HSARC-242), mailed solicitations to thirty-four companies, advertised on the County's Internet and on publicpurchase.com. Only one response was received to the RFP. Purchasing staff made followed-up phone calls to the other companies who had received the RFP but who had not submitted a proposal. Through these calls Purchasing staff determined that the other companies felt that they did not have the ability or resources to provide the services requested.

The one proposal received was reviewed by an evaluation team consisting of personnel from Riverside County Department of Public Health Disease Control and HIV/STD Branch. The evaluation team reviewed the proposal's overall responsiveness and general understanding to the requirements of the scope of service, company capabilities, experience and ability to perform, financial status, references and the overall cost.

Through this procurement process, the Evaluation Committee decided that Desert AIDS Project met all requirements in the County RFP Scope of Service and is well qualified to perform services required in Eastern Riverside County. The Evaluation Committee recommends the award be given to Desert AIDS Project.

Grant funded total of \$40,000 to test 555 unaware individuals which break down to \$72 per tested individual. It would cost the County over \$100 per individual to provide these tests. Desert AIDS Project charges other agencies the same amount proposed to Riverside County.
