#### **BACKGROUND (Continued):**

The purpose of the EMPG program is to support comprehensive emergency management at the State, Tribal and local levels and to encourage the improvement of mitigation, preparedness, response and recovery capabilities for all hazards. Funding from this grant is available to all eligible agencies and jurisdictions through the OA. All matching funds are the responsibility of the awarded agency or jurisdiction.

**FINANCIAL INFORMATION:** 50% Federal Funding and 50% local cash or in-kind funding. Local jurisdictions receiving funds will be responsible for all matching contributions for their funding. The 50 % match portion of funding dedicated to Fire - OES will be matched by in-kind contributions derived from Emergency Services Coordinators' regular salaries.

The balance of \$323,410 will be passed through to eligible agencies/cities.
