#### **BACKGROUND (Continued):**

On July 17, 2012 the County Board of Supervisors ratified agenda item 2.3 approving submittal of the grant application and designating Authorized Agents for the FY12 HSGP. The California Emergency Management Agency (CalEMA) has awarded the Riverside County OA federal pass-through funding in the amount of \$1,735,312 to enhance local agencies and jurisdictions abilities to prevent, deter, respond to and recover from threats and incidents of terrorism and catastrophic events. The Riverside County OA will, in turn, pass \$1,480,290 through to cities and agencies. The remaining will be retained for Fire/OES projects.

The Department of Public Health was awarded SHSGP funding to purchase and maintain a cache of pharmaceuticals for first responders and their families. The goal of the cache is to provide a three-day supply of medication, thereby sustaining the first responder community until additional resources can be obtained through regional or state caches or from the federally deployed Strategic National Stockpile (SNS). Public Health will purchase pharmaceuticals to enhance the stockpile of antibiotics. Public Health will also fund a Registered Nurse that will enhance the First Responder Prophylaxis Plan, manage and maintain the pharmaceutical inventory, develop and update protocols, and update the CHEMPACK plan.

Public Health activities will focus on the recruitment, enhancement, and retention of the Medical Volunteer Program. Planning activities will also focus on developing a Standard Operating Guidelines, Departmental Operations procedures and an All Hazard Emergency Operations Plan for a medical response within the county. The Bio-Watch Program is critical component of the overall Medical Surge project within the county. The plan will be updated and enhanced, and an exercise will test the capabilities of the plan. Phase 2 of the UHF radio repeater site project will begin. This infrastructure will afford better interoperability between all EMS providers.

The Riverside County Sheriff's Department, through the Regional Training Program (RTP) will provide training to Law Enforcement entities in Fire, Public Health, Education and a variety of additional first responder organizations. This multi-disciplinary effort is focused on achieving national preparedness guidelines. The use of subject matter experts to formulate and deliver key training topics effectively prepares the first responders in Riverside County for any "all risk" type events.

Riverside County Fire - OES will develop a continuity of Operations (COOP) and Continuity of Government (COG) plan for the County of Riverside. Riverside County currently does not have a complete and comprehensive COOP/COG plan. Additionally, very few cities and agencies in the county have developed COOP/COG plans. Recent events show the need for a government agency to be prepared to respond to emergencies and a COOP/COG plan is a vital part of the response and recovery efforts. The lack of a current COOP/COG plan can severely impact the emergency response and recovery of local government. By having an up to date COOP/COG plan, it would enable all agencies and key officials to be on the same playing field when involved in a disaster.

### **BACKGROUND** (continued):

The lead agency for the HSGP grant is Riverside County Fire - OES, on behalf of the OA.

On December 18, 2002, item 3.26, the County Board of Supervisors appointed the Anti-Terrorism Approval Authority (ATAA) as the review board used for determining the utilization and distribution of HSGP funds. For FY12, ATAA has recommended, and the OA has been awarded, funding for the following projects. The benefit of these 8 projects will be realized among 23 cities and agencies throughout Riverside County:

Additionally, Aviation/Watercraft requests, Establish/Enhance Emergency Operations Center (EOC) projects, projects requiring Environmental and Historic Preservation (EHP) review and Sole Source Procurement requests will require additional approvals from Cal EMA. Subgrantees must obtain written approval for these activities **prior** to incurring any costs, in order to be reimbursed for any related costs under this grant. Subgrantees are required to obtain a performance bond for any equipment item over \$250,000, or any vehicle, aviation, or watercraft (regardless of the cost) financed with homeland security dollars.

Following acceptance of this award, you must enter your grant information into the US Office of Grants and Training, Grant Reporting Tool (GRT), for the December 2012 Biannual Strategy Implementation Report (BSIR) period. The GRT can be accessed online at <a href="https://www.reporting.odp.dhs.gov/">https://www.reporting.odp.dhs.gov/</a>. Semi-annual performance reports must be prepared and submitted to Cal EMA via the GRT for the duration of the grant period or until all activities are completed and the grant is formally closed. Failure to submit performance reports could result in grant reduction, termination, or suspension.
