BACKGROUND/APPOINTEE INFORMATION:
The Riverside County Children and Families Commission (RCCFC) was established by this Board in the adoption of Ordinance 784, enacted on January 22, 1999. The Commission implements the provisions of Proposition 10, which provides tobacco tax funds to facilitate the creation and implementation of an integrated, comprehensive, and collaborative system of information and services to enhance optimal early childhood development and to ensure that children are ready to enter school.

SUBJECT: Recommendation of Reappointment of Lupe Watson to the Riverside County Children and Families Commission.

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Ordinance 784 specifies that the Commission membership shall consist of nine members. One member shall be a member of the Board of Supervisors. One member shall be the Public Health Officer. The Board of Supervisors shall appoint one member who is responsible for management of any of the following county functions: children's services, public health services, behavioral health services, social services, and tobacco and other substance abuse prevention and treatment services.

The Board of Supervisors shall also appoint the remaining six members of the Commission. Each member of the Board of Supervisors shall nominate one member and the sixth member shall be selected at-large.

On June 9, 2009 the Board of Supervisors amended the membership section (Section 5, subsection B.) of Ordinance 784 to reflect the appointment of six Commissioners and six Alternate Commissioners. Each member of the Board of Supervisors is to appoint one Commissioner and one Alternate with the sixth being an At-Large Appointment by the entire Board. The Alternate Commissioners will also serve as Advisory Committee members, in compliance with Proposition 10 statutes.

These remaining members shall be any of the following: (1) recipients of project services included in the County Strategic Plan; (2) educators specializing in early childhood development; (3) representatives of a local child care resource or referral agency, or a local child care coordinating group; (4) representatives of a local organization for prevention or early intervention for families at risk; (5) representatives of community-based organizations that have the goal of promoting nurturing and early childhood development; (6) representatives of local school districts; and (7) representatives of local medical, pediatric, or obstetric associations or societies. Although a member from each of the above-referenced categories is not required, it is desirable that members from as many categories as possible serve on the Commission at all times. Any member appointed to the Commission pursuant to this subsection shall reside and/or work in Riverside County at the time of appointment and for the duration of his or her term.

Ms. Watson is currently a member of the Indio City Council and a F5R Commissioner with a term expiring on February 1, 2013. Ms. Watson also serves on Coachella Valley Association of Governments Human and Community Committee and on the Homeless Committee. She qualifies as a representative of a local organization for prevention or early intervention for families at risk, and will serve as an Alternate to Commissioner Lisa Larson. No Commission member or Alternate may serve more than two consecutive terms. The Commission is recommending that Ms. Ramos-Watson be reappointed for a term as an Alternate Commissioner for District 4 effective February 1, 2013, and ending February 1, 2016.
