BACKGROUND: The Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) has allocated funding to the County under the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) under the Anti-Drug Abuse (ADA) Enforcement Team Program.

Since 1993, annual grant awards from the ADA program, along with asset forfeiture monies, have funded the efforts of six interagency task forces that target offenses related to illegal drug activities related to illegal drug activities and a program that facilitates early disposition of narcotics cases. The ADA grant project is a cooperative effort that includes the Sheriff's Department, District Attorney's Office, Probation, Department of Public Social Services, Public Defender, state agencies and municipal police departments throughout the County.

The attached resolution has been approved as to form by County Counsel.



5 WHEREAS the County of Riverside desires to participate in the Anti Drug Abuse
6 Enforcement Team Grant Program supported by the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice
7 Assistance Grant Program funds and administered by the Board of State and Community
8 Corrections (hereafter referred to as the BSCC).

9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED by the Board of
10 Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California, in regular session assembled
11 on _____, that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside does
12 hereby:

- 13 1. Authorize, on behalf of the County of Riverside Board of Supervisors, the Sheriff, the
14 Undersheriff, the Assistant Sheriff, or the Chief Deputy to act on the County of
15 Riverside's behalf in grant matters to include: application submission, resulting award
16 agreements, reimbursement requests and future amendments and/or modifications
17 not increasing the award by more than 20% and that do not materially change the
18 scope of the grant project;
- 19 2. Assure that the grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant
20 expenditures controlled by this body;
- 21 3. Agree that the implementing agency/organization and partnering entities abide by the
22 statutes and regulations governing the federal Justice Assistance Grant Program as
23 well as the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement as set forth by the BSCC.
