SUBJECT: Reward

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors offers a reward of up to \$100,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of Christopher Jordan Dorner.


BACKGROUND: On February 3, 2013, Christopher Jordan Dorner ("Dorner") allegedly killed Monica Quan and her fiancé, Keith Lawrence, who were both found dead in a car in Irvine. In a separate shooting, Dorner allegedly shot and grazed the head of a Los Angeles police officer who was in Corona. On February 7, 2013, Dorner allegedly killed Riverside Police Officer Michael Crain and wounded his partner while they were on routine patrol. Officer Crain served in the U. S. Marines in Kuwait and is survived by his wife, a ten-year-old son and four-year-old daughter.

The killings in Irvine are believed to be linked to Dorner's firing from the Los Angeles Police Department four years ago. Monica Quan was the daughter of Randal K. Quan, a retired LAPD officer who represented Dorner at his termination hearing.


The Titan pick-up truck Dorner was driving was found on fire on February 7, 2013 on a service road near Big Bear Lake in San Bernardino County. Since February 7, there have been no confirmed sightings of Dorner, the 6-foot-tall, 270-pound former LAPD officer.

The Board of Supervisors is authorized by Government Code section 53069.5 to offer and pay a reward in connection with the determination of the identity of, and the apprehension of, any person whose willful misconduct results in injury or death to any person. The proposed motion would authorize a reward of up to \$100,000 for new information leading to the arrest and conviction of Christopher Jordan Dorner. In the event that more than one person files a claim for the reward, and is eligible to receive proceeds from the reward, the Executive Office will consult with law enforcement officials to determine the importance of the information to the investigation. The Executive Office will then provide the Board of Supervisors with recommendations about what portion of the reward should go to each claimant. The total of the reward payments in this case shall not exceed \$100,000, regardless of the number of claimants or the dates by which they file their claims.
