The Sheriff's Department and a victim service provider will investigate trafficking crimes and provide aid to victims of human trafficking.

On June 30, 2010, the County was awarded a \$500,000 Anti-Human Trafficking grant from the California Emergency Management Agency (CalEMA) to develop multi-disciplinary participation with federal, state and local law enforcement agencies; prosecution and non-governmental organizations for the purpose of identifying trafficked victims. CalEMA has awarded the County an additional \$200,000 to continue the Anti-Human Trafficking project in Calendar Year 2013.

The grant application to the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) and the Office for Victims of Crime (OVC) will expand upon the Anti-Human Trafficking model and services available to victims. The grant solicitation from the DOJ BJA OVC requires certifications and assurances from the Board. In addition, the grant requires a local share commitment of 25% cash or an in-kind match. Any resulting grant award will be brought to the Board for review and decision to accept the funds, contingent on the availability of the local share at that time.
