The SCFA animal shelter has been in operation since October 2010. Housing in the shelter has increased to near capacity, servicing and housing approximately 200 dogs and cats per day. The shelter currently owns and operates one cargo van, but is in dire need of an additional cargo van. The van will be utilized for all AFV shelter-related matters, including transportation of any of its animals, foodstuff, supplies, etc.

The van will be donated to the SCFA JPA as a non-profit agency. Annual operations and maintenance of the van will be the JPA's responsibility. A one-time cost of \$2,500 will be transferred to Fleet Services in lieu of the salvage value of the van.
