RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move that the Board of Supervisors adopt Resolution #2013-102, which authorizes the Sheriff, the Undersheriff, the Assistant Sheriff, or the Chief Deputy to sign and submit a grant application to the Board of State and Community Corrections for \$185,427 to continue Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) programs in Riverside County.

BACKGROUND: The Sheriff's Department has been operating a successful Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) program at the Larry D. Smith Correctional Facility since October 1998. The program provides both male and female inmates vital substance abuse treatment and is structured to reduce recidivism within the county jail system.

The program is a collaborative effort between the Sheriff's Department, Probation Department, Department of Mental Health, and Riverside County Office of Education (RCOE). The Sheriff's Department provides custody at the Larry D. Smith Correctional Facility and substance abuse treatment through Sheriff's Correctional Counseling personnel. RCOE provides substance abuse education and vocational education training. Mental Health offers a transitional reentry plan for co-occurring adult offenders being released from RSAT, and the Probation Department assigns officers to interface with the courts on behalf of the inmates and monitor them after release.

The grant application requires a 25% match of the total project cost of \$247,236 in the amount of \$61,809. The Inmate Welfare Fund committee approved funding the required 25% grant match that will be used by the Sheriff's Department to offset salaries and benefits. Any grant awarded will be submitted to the Board of Supervisors for review and approval.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE AUTHORIZING SUBMITTAL OF GRANT APPLICATION FOR BOARD OF STATE AND COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS (BSCC) RESIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT (RSAT) PROGRAM

WHEREAS. The County of Riverside, Sheriff's Department, desires to participate in the Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) for State Prisoners Program, federally funded through the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) and administered by the Board of State and Community Corrections (hereafter referred to as BSCC);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sheriff, the Undersheriff, the Assistant Sheriff or the Chief Deputy are authorized on behalf of this Governing Board to submit the grant proposal for this funding, sign the Grant Agreement with the BSCC, including any amendments thereof not increasing the award by more than 20 percent and that do not materially change the scope of the grant project, and sign and submit all requests for reimbursement and required reports;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the federal grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Riverside County Sheriff's Department agrees to provide all matching funds required for said project and abide by the statutes and regulations governing the federal Grants Program as well as the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement as set forth by the BSCC.
