SUBJECT: Approval of Hewlett-Packard Corp. as the Single Source Provider of Two Computer Operating Systems to Upgrade and Replace the Sheriff's Jail Information Management System

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move that the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Approve Hewlett-Packard Company (HP) as a single source provider for the purchase of two HP computer operating systems to upgrade and replace the current Jail Information Management System in the amount of \$148,480, without securing competitive bids, in accordance with Ordinance 459.4.
- 2. Subsequent to a three-year product warranty period, authorize the Purchasing Agent to approve future needed expenditures with HP not to exceed \$30,000 annually through the remaining life of the equipment or until June 30, 2023, whichever comes first.

BACKGROUND: The Riverside County Sheriff's Department uses the Hewlett Packard (HP) computer systems to support the JIMS (Jail Information Management System) application for the booking, housing and movement of the approximately 4,000 adult inmates in the custody of the County. The system also supports other agencies within the County such as Probation, Detention Health Services, the District Attorney and the Courts for in-custody information, as well as outside agencies such as ICE, County approved vendors, Commissary and Inmate Telephone systems.

HP has given the department written and verbal notice that our current systems have reached the end of their useful lives. Although they continue to perform as needed, both HP and department staff's concern is that with increased system utilization, system performance will decrease. Further, due to the age of the current systems (they were installed in 2003), we have already begun to experience hardware component failure.

With the growing demands of the user community, other agency interfaces, new and existing vendor connectivity, the system has long since reached critical mass. With new requirements on the horizon, the department is requesting the immediate replacement of the aged JIMS Systems computer systems.

The department is proposing this purchase as a single source, due to the fact that the JIMS System was designed and configured to run on the HP/UX Operating System utilizing MC/Service Guard (currently). The application (Javabased) has been benchmarked to transition to the requested hardware without any additional expense.

The system (application and hardware) uses the HP/UX & MC/Service Guard operating environment to provide security and uptime required of the Correction Division's 7x24 hour operation. No other vendor provides HP/UX and MC/Service Guard than HP.

PRICE REASONABLENESS: Sheriff's Technical Services Bureau Commander and staff worked with the HP sales representatives to ensure that the best governmental pricing and discounting was offered to the Sheriff's Department. The purchase price for the two systems includes Hardware \$87,084, Software \$350.00, Maintenance \$27,728 and Installation \$33,318, for a total cost of \$148,480.

Subsequent to a three-year product warranty period, the department is requesting a \$30,000 spending authorization for the remaining useful life of the equipment, or until June 30, 2023, whichever occurs first.

Subject:

Single Source Procurement; Request for two HP rx2800 computer systems for Sheriffs Corrections

(JIMS) Jail Information Management System.

The below information is provided in support of my Department requesting approval for a single source. Outside of a duly declared emergency, the time to develop a statement of work or specifications is not in itself justification for Single source.

- 1. Supply/Service being requested: The purchase of two computer systems, operating system, licensing of firmware, hardware and software maintenance, installation and application migration services.
- 2. Supplier being requested: Hewlett-Packard Company (HP)
- 3. Alternative suppliers that can or might be able to provide supply/service: None. The HP Jail Information Management System (JIMS) system was first purchased in 2003, and has required only minor hardware changes since its original installation. The current equipment was deemed to be at the end of its life in 2009 by HP, however it committed to continue providing maintenance through 2013. The JIMS user community has more than doubled with the growth of the county's inmate population, expanded jail capacity and the impact of AB-109. Recent software modifications, made to accommodate additional users on the system, presented yet another challenge to already over extended systems resources. Therefore, age as well new capacity requirements imposed upon the current hardware have made it difficult to maintain an adequate level of system response time.
- **4. Extent of market search conducted:** None. The JIMS System was designed and configured to run on the HP/UX Operating System utilizing MC/Service Guard (currently). The application (Java-based) has been benchmarked to transition to the requested hardware without any additional expense.
- 5. Unique features of the supply/service being requested from this supplier, which no alternative supplier can provide: The JIMS application is owned by the Sheriff's Department and has run exclusively under the HP/UX & MC/Service Guard operating environment since 2003. The system (application and hardware) uses that operating environment to provide security and uptime required of the Correction Division's 7x24 hour operation. No other vendor provides HP/UX and MC/Service Guard than HP.
- 6. Reasons why my department requires these unique features and what benefit will accrue to the county: The JIMS application provides mission critical in-custody tracking of inmates housed in the county's five jails. This responsibility demands the maximum amount of computer system up time, which the requested hardware, software and operating environment is designed to provide.

- 7. Price Reasonableness including purchase price and any ongoing maintenance or ancillary costs from the supplier: Sheriff's Technical Services Bureau Commander and staff worked with the HP sales representatives to ensure that the best governmental pricing and discounting was offered to the Sheriff's Department. The purchase price for the two systems includes hardware \$87,084, software \$350.00, maintenance \$27,728 and installation \$33,318 for a total cost of \$148,480. The current system's annual maintenance and software cost is \$44,692, and is anticipated to increase by a minimum of 5% annually until replacement parts are no longer available. If the platform is replaced, the maintenance cost is included in the three year manufacturer warranty. Following the three year warranty period, the expected maintenance and software costs should be approximately \$27,728 (or lower) annually. As a result, the department will realize a minimum cost savings of \$17,000 per year, or approximately \$50,892 over the next 3 years. The life of the new systems is 8 to 10 years, depending on growth.
- 8. Does moving forward on this product or service further obligate the county to future similar contractual arrangements or any ongoing costs affiliated with this sole source? (Maintenance, support, or upgrades, if so, please explain). Yes, the department will be purchasing maintenance and future upgrades from HP.
- 9. Period of Performance: One time purchase of two systems in the amount not to exceed \$148,480.00, and subsequent to a three-year warranty period, allow the Purchasing Agent to authorize future upgrades not to exceed \$30,000 annually through the life of the equipment or June 30, 2023, whichever comes first.
