RE: Gilman Springs Road Roadway Improvements, Eastern Moreno Valley

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BACKGROUND:

The Transportation Improvement Program provides for safety and maintenance improvements along Gilman Springs Road, in the eastern Moreno Valley area of Riverside County. The proposed project improvements include curve realignments, shoulder widening, construction of a passing lane, construction of a left turn pocket at Alessandro Boulevard, pavement rehabilitation, installation of drainage, and safety improvements, including the installation of centerline and edge of pavement rumble strips. The passing lane will start southerly of Alessandro Boulevard and will be in the southbound direction. Pavement repair at isolated areas near Jack Rabbit Trail will also be performed as part of this contract.

The project will include work within the City of Moreno Valley starting southerly of State Route 60 and ending northerly of Kevin Road. The scope of work within the City includes pavement rehabilitation and the realignment of the Alessandro Boulevard intersection at Gilman Springs Road. A Reimbursement Agreement with the City of Moreno Valley, in the amount of \$839,500, was executed by the Board of Supervisors on February 26, 2013 (Agenda Item 3.66).

The safety improvements along Gilman Springs Road include corrections to curves in the road and raising the roadbed at locations where existing low spots are present, these changes to the existing roadbed will require substantial construction grading. In an effort to cause the least impact to the community and build this project quickly and safely, the contractor will be allowed to close Gilman Springs Road between State Route 60 to Bridge Street and Alessandro Boulevard from Theodore Street to Gilman Springs Road for forty-five (45) consecutive calendar days within the construction period. The Contractor will be allowed to work from 6am to 6pm, seven (7) days a week and will have sixty (60) calendar days, including holidays to complete this project. Access will be maintained for local residents, businesses and their employees when construction is in progress and during the road closure. The County is working closely with Caltrans and the Cities of Moreno Valley, San Jacinto, and Hemet to plan and coordinate closures and detours. Information will be distributed to impacted communities, and they will be informed ahead of any proposed construction activities.

The bid documents include the following four schedules of work:

Base Bid Schedule 1:

Curve Realignment, Shoulder Widening, Left Turn Pocket, Passing Lane, and Resurfacing within the County's jurisdiction.

Base Bid Schedule 2:

Resurfacing of Gilman Springs Rd and Realignment of Alessandro Blvd. in the City of Moreno Valley.

Base Bid Schedule 3:

Roadway Repair at Jack Rabbit Trail and isolated areas on Gilman Springs Road within the County's jurisdiction.

Alternate Bid Schedule 1:

Culvert Replacement in the City of Moreno Valley

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Base Bid Schedule 2 and Alternate Bid Schedule 1 are for work within the City of Moreno Valley. If the City of Moreno Valley concurs with bid prices for Alternate bid schedule 1, as bid by the apparent low bidder, the Alternate 1 bid schedule will be included with the contract award and the costs for the work will be funded by the City, as agreed by the terms of the reimbursement agreement.

The submitted plans and specifications have been approved as to form by County Counsel.

Environmental clearance is complete.

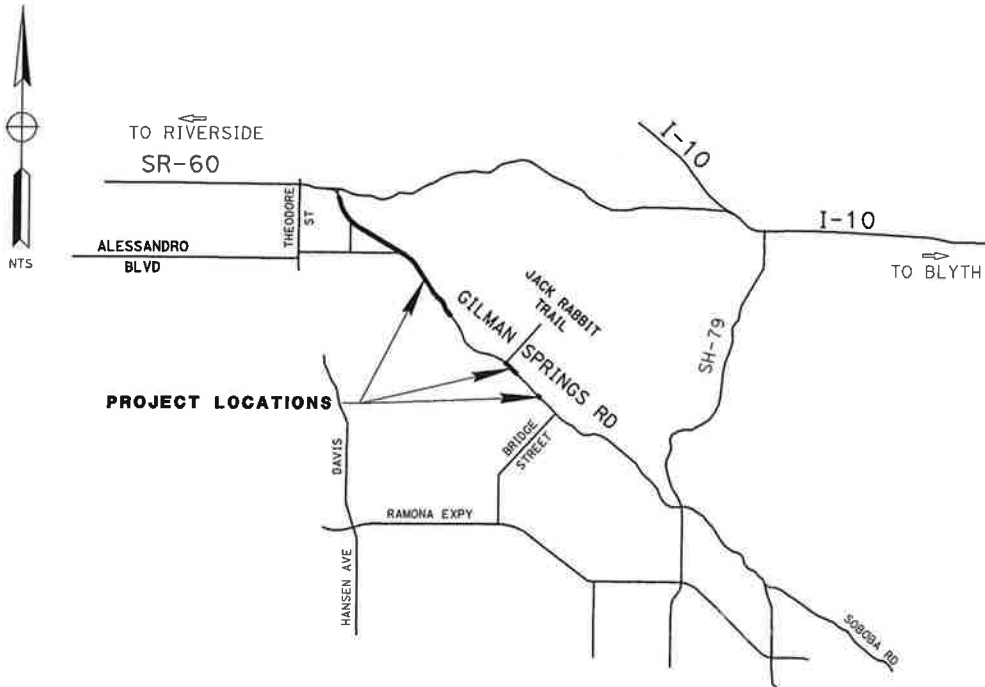
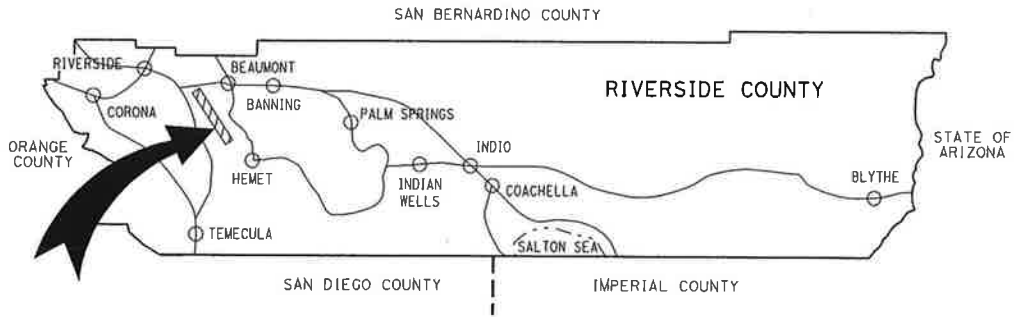
