BACKGROUND: The Transportation Improvement Program provides for the resurfacing of Stanford Street from Thornton Avenue to Florida Avenue, approximately 1.5 miles, and the construction of a traffic signal at the intersection of Stanford Street and Mayberry Avenue in the East Hemet community.

The existing pavement will be removed and new pavement will be placed. Additionally, curbs and gutters that are in poor condition will be replaced, and driveway approaches impacted by the project will be replaced. Any existing access ramps that do not meet the current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements will be improved or replaced to meet the requirements. Several new access ramps will also be constructed. New thermoplastic pavement markings, painted traffic stripes, and reflective pavement markers will be installed.

Funding for construction of these improvements will be provided by Proposition 1B (State Bond Funds – Local Roads) and partly by the Development Impact Fee (DIF) program. The DIF program, which is governed under Ordinance 659.6, allows for the use of DIF funds for traffic signal facilities.

The proposed traffic signal will enhance capacity and improve safety by providing protected traffic movements and pedestrian crossings.

Annual traffic signal operation and maintenance costs are estimated at \$5,500, which will be funded from gas tax.

The submitted plans and specifications have been approved as to form by County Counsel.

Environmental clearance is complete.


