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**BACKGROUND:** The Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) provides for the Clay Street/UPRR Grade Separation Project in the City.

Clay Street Grade Separation Project funds were budgeted, and construction drawings were substantially prepared prior to the incorporation of the City. The City desires for the County of Riverside (County) to continue as lead agency through the completion of this project. The City has approved the construction drawings, and the Board of Supervisors approved a Cooperative Agreement by Minute Order dated February 26, 2013 (Agenda Item 3-67).

Clay Street is a four-lane major highway in the City that connects Limonite Avenue with Van Buren Boulevard. Clay Street carries over 17,000 vehicles per day. A UPRR at-grade crossing currently exists on Clay Street just east of Van Buren Boulevard. Currently, 30 freight and 12 passenger trains pass through Clay Street grade crossing on a daily basis, which is projected to increase to 45 freight and 28 passenger trains by 2030. The increase in number of trains will cause frequent interruptions in the normal flow of highway traffic. Traffic congestion in the area may increase potential train/vehicle accidents.

The new underpass bridge will provide uninterrupted flow for motorists, pedestrians, bicycle, emergency vehicle, and train traffic at the crossing. The completion of this project will substantially reduce particulate matter and greenhouse gases caused by idling vehicles and decrease noise due to the elimination of the need to sound the train horn at the crossing for safety.

The proposed construction will be performed without affecting the railroad operations. The bid documents include the following two schedules of work:

Base Bid Schedule 1: Grade separation bridge, roadway widening, and associated work

Base Bid Schedule 2: Traffic signal and lighting, signing, striping, and associated work at the intersection of Clay Street and General Drive

The project includes reconstruction of Clay Street to pass under the existing UPRR railway, construction of a railroad bridge for the existing UPRR railway, and lowering of grade elevation at General Drive and at Linares Avenue that will tie into the new lower Clay Street grade. The UPRR bridge will be approximately 105 feet long and 60 feet wide. This bridge will accommodate a total of two tracks plus a maintenance access road/future track. The roadway reconstruction will include widening, traffic signal, street lighting, landscaping, and associated improvements.

On June 11, 2013, the California Transportation Commission allocated \$13.247 million to this project for construction and construction engineering from the Proposition 1B, Trade Corridor Improvement Funds (TCIF). TCIF funding requires that a construction contract for this project must be awarded on or before December 31, 2013.

The submitted plans and specifications have been approved as to form by County Counsel. Environmental clearance is complete.


