WHEREAS, by participating in The Great California ShakeOut, the County of Riverside has the opportunity to join and support all Californians in strengthening community and regional resiliency; and,

WHEREAS, by supporting The Great California ShakeOut, the County of Riverside can educate its residents regarding actions to protect life and property, including mitigating structural and non-structural hazards and participating in earthquake drills; and,

WHEREAS, by registering at www.ShakeOut.org, Riverside County employees can participate in the ShakeOut "Drop, Cover and Hold On" earthquake drill on October 17, 2013, at 10:17 a.m. and encourage the public, schools, businesses, and other community stakeholders to register also.
