#### **BACKGROUND:**

### Summary

On March 12, 2013 (3.41) the Board authorized the Sheriff to apply for \$500,000 in grants funds from the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) and the Office for Victims of Crime (OVC).

The County of Riverside has been notified that the FY 2013 grant has been approved in the amount of \$500,000. In Fiscal Year 2013-2014, program funds will be used to pay for salary and benefits of a Sheriff Investigator in addition to overtime salary. The grant project budget period is from 10/01/13 through 09/30/15.

The grant funds 75% or \$500,000 of total project costs. The remaining 25% or \$166,666 of total project costs is met through an in-kind match in personnel and operating categories, which is in the Sheriff's Department's budget. Budget adjustments required for fiscal year 2013-14 total \$ 201,488 for current fiscal year project cost.

Million Kids, a non-governmental, non-profit organization, is the task force core collaborative partner in the project. Million Kids will provide educational, medical and legal aid to survivors of trafficking in addition to the development of the task force first responder subcommittee. The Board should note that, as a grant project partner, Million Kids will be utilized as a sole source contractor.

County Counsel has approved the documents as to form.

### Impact on Citizens and Businesses

The grant funds 75% of total project cost and provide resources in the county to educate, prevent and intervene and treat victims of sex trafficking, labor trafficking and exploitation. Million Kids, a non-governmental, non-profit organization will assist activist and communities to develop effective anti-human trafficking programs in their locales.

Subject: Categorical Exclusion for County of Riverside

The purpose of this award is to support a comprehensive approach to combating human trafficking in all forms; sex trafficking and labor trafficking of foreign nationals and U.S. citizens (male and female, adults and minors, including transgender individuals). The victim service provider will work in partnership with the BJA recipient funded under this award to: 1) conduct proactive, victim-centered trafficking investigations; 2) provide a comprehensive array of restorative services to meet each victim; individual needs; 3) support the prosecution of trafficking crimes on state and federal levels; and 4) conduct training and public awareness activities that enhance community capacity to identify trafficking crimes and provide culturally appropriate, trauma-informed services to all trafficking victims identified within the geographic region.

None of the following activities will be conducted either under the OJP federal action or a related third party action: 1) New construction; 2) Any renovation or remodeling of a property either (a) listed on or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places or (b) located within a 100-year flood plain; 3) A renovation which will change the basic prior use of a facility or significantly change its size; 4) Research and technology whose anticipated and future application could be expected to have an effect on the environment; or 5) Implementation of a program involving the use of chemicals. Consequently, the subject federal action meets OJP's criteria for a categorical exclusion as contained in paragraph 4(b) of Appendix D to Part 61 of the Code of Federal Regulations. Additionally, the proposed action is neither a phase nor a segment or a project which when viewed in its entirety would not meet the criteria for a categorical exclusion.
