#### **BACKGROUND:**

#### Summary

Since 1993, annual grant awards from the ADA Enforcement Team Program, along with asset forfeiture monies, have funded the efforts of six interagency task forces that target offenses related to illegal drug activities and a program that facilitates early disposition of narcotics cases. The ADA grant project is a cooperative effort that includes the Sheriff's Department, District Attorney's Office, Probation, Department of Public Social Services, Public Defender, state agencies and municipal police departments throughout the County.

Grant funding will continue to be used for the purposes of enforcing the state and local controlled substances law and to combat violence associated with illegal drugs. County Counsel has approved the documents as to form.

### **Impact on Citizens and Businesses**

The grant project focus of the ADA Enforcement Team Program is the support of multi-jurisdictional drug task forces to combat street to mid-level drug sales, manufacturing and distribution in addition to collaborating with school superintendents, treatment and rehabilitation professionals as appropriate to the project.

## RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE, AUTHORIZING SUBMITTAL OF ANTI DRUG ABUSE ENFORCEMENT GRANT

WHEREAS the County of Riverside desires to participate in the Anti Drug Abuse Enforcement Team Grant Program supported by the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program funds and administered by the Board of State and Community Corrections (hereafter referred to as the BSCC).

- 1. - 2. Assure that the grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body;
- 3. Agree that the implementing agency/organization and partnering entities abide by the statutes and regulations governing the federal Justice Assistance Grant Program as well as the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement as set forth by the BSCC.
