BACKGROUND:

Summary (continued)

The Department of Environmental Health is partially responsible for the testing of air quality for certain hazardous materials including radiation and needs the ability to relay information to a central location of responders to determine possible necessary action. This equipment will assist in meeting this responsibility by reducing the risk of exposure to hazardous materials and maintaining public safety. The equipment requested is currently proprietary to NucSafe, Inc. and they are the sole provider in the United States. Currently no compatible equipment exists and therefore, no other bids were obtained. This equipment is currently used by Homeland Security and the County is receiving the same Federal GSA pricing offered all governmental agencies.

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

The Department of Environmental Health is partially responsible for testing the air quality and maintaining public safety; this equipment will assist staff in testing and relaying information to responders and help in determining any required action. There is no negative fiscal impact to citizens and businesses but this system will provide an indirect benefit by allowing the Department to enable the public to return to an evacuated area more quickly.

SUPPLEMENTAL:

Additional Fiscal Information

The County currently has a Memorandum of Understanding effective through January 30, 2014 with the State of California (Public Health Emergency Preparedness and Response) and provides distribution of grant monies for emergency response spending plan and reimbursement. The estimated \$500.00 on going cost is to cover any unanticipated minor repairs or adjustments.

Currently the equipment requested is under GSA contract GS-07F-0725F effective through August 28, 2016 at the cost of \$48,422.00 plus tax 4116.00 and \$100.00 shipping for a total of \$52,638.00. Any administration fee charged by GSA is included in the cost of the equipment and was verified with the GSA representative.

Contract History and Price Reasonableness

Nucsafe, Inc. is the manufacturer and sole provider of the required equipment contracted with GSA. No other pricing is available. Purchasing has approved the Sole Source Justification and concurs with this request.
