BACKGROUND:

Summary

On July 16, 2013, the Board of Supervisors approved and adopted the Final Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the East County Detention Center (ECDC) project. The construction documents are being prepared and the project team is making preparations for the bidding phase. This pre-qualification process for selecting a pool of qualified general contractors will help ensure that bids will be received from entities with a track record of experience on large complex facilities such as a detention center.

The Local Agency Public Construction Act (Public Contract Code Section 20100 et seq.) and Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act (Public Contract Code Section 22000 et seq.) requires officials to invite bids for construction projects and award contracts to the lowest responsible bidder. The Local Agency Public Construction Act (Public Contract Code Section 20101 et seq.) allows officials to pre-qualify contractors for public works projects.

It is recommended that the Board approve the Pre-Qualification Package for General Contractors. Following a review of the General Contracting firms prequalification's the Economic Development Agency will return to the Board for approval of a short list of firms. These firms would be invited to submit bids for the project.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Approval of the pre-qualification of general contractors will position the county to expedite the construction of the ECDC project. This effort will enhance public safety and provide job creation, thus providing positive impacts to area residents and businesses of Indio.

Additional Fiscal Information

All costs associated with this project will be fully funded through the General Fund to be reimbursed by Bond Proceeds, thus no net county costs will be incurred. No budget increase is required at this time.

The following General Contractor Application for Pre-Qualification (AFP) package is distributed by the County of Riverside Economic Development Agency (EDA) on behalf of the County of Riverside (County) with the intent to pre-qualify General Contractors (Contractor) for construction of the public works project titled East County Detention Center (Project), a new adult detention facility located at 46057 Oasis Street, Indio, California 92201. The Project will be operated by the Riverside County Sheriff's Department and will consist of two phases; Phase1 – Construction of a Housing Building and connecting Support Building and, Phase 2- Demolition of the existing jail and construction of landscape, hardscape and parking.

The facility will utilize modern electronic security systems that will optimize security while minimizing staffing requirements. The facility will offer more convenience to the public and the inmates through the use of video visitation and state-of-the-art telecommunication systems. The facility will include various ancillary support functions including Kitchen, Medical and Administrative services. The Project is funded by the State's AB900 Local Adult Detention Facility Program and the County of Riverside. Your firm is invited to review the AFP and respond to all items. Your responses will enable the County to pre-select general building contractors to bid on the Project based on experience and qualifications. Upon receipt the AFP will be opened and evaluated by the County, resulting in a list of general contractors deemed qualified to bid the Project.

1. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS AND INFORMATION

A. General Information

A current California type **B** contractor's license is required to bid the Project.

This Pre-Qualification to bid the East County Detention Center project (Project), located at 46057 Oasis Street, Indio, California, is required regardless of and in addition to any pre-qualification for the County of Riverside (County) work which a general contractor may already have on file.

Pre-Qualification by the County, for this Project, shall remain valid until the contract for construction is awarded or until responding firms are notified in writing by the County in the unexpected event that no construction contract is awarded. It is mandatory that all General Contractors (Contractor) who intend to submit a bid fully complete the pre-qualification questionnaire, provide all materials requested, and be approved by the County to be on the final qualified Bidders list. No bid will be accepted from a Contractor that has failed to comply with these requirements. If two or more business entities submit a bid as part of a Joint Venture, or expect to submit a bid as part of a Joint Venture, each entity within the Joint Venture must be separately qualified to bid.

NOTES:

1. Each partner of joint venture proposals must individually meet the conditions of Contractor's Evaluation Form and the Contractor's License has not been suspended, put on probation or revoked at any time in the last five (5) years.
2. Limited Liability Corporations (LLC) will be required to comply with a Guarantee of Obligations.

Answers to questions contained in the attached questionnaire, information about current bonding capacity, notarized statement from surety, and the most recent reviewed or audited financial statements, with accompanying notes and supplemental information are required. The County will use these documents as the basis of rating Contractors in respect to whether a Contractor is qualified to bid on Project. The County reserves the right to check other sources available. The County's decision will be based on objective evaluation criteria as described in the prequalification package.

The County reserves the right to adjust, increase, limit, suspend or rescind the pre-qualification rating based on subsequently learned information. Contractors whose rating changes sufficient to disqualify them will be notified, and given an opportunity for a hearing consistent with the hearing procedures described below for appealing a pre-qualification rating.

While it is the intent of the AFP and required documents to assist the County in determining bidder responsibility prior to bid and to aid the County in selecting the lowest responsible bidder, neither the fact of pre-qualification, nor any pre-qualification rating, will preclude the County from a post-bid consideration and determination of whether a bidder has the quality, fitness, capacity and experience to satisfactorily perform the proposed work, and has demonstrated the requisite trustworthiness to be awarded a contract pursuant to California Public Contract Code. This Project is being financed in part through State AB900 funding and is subject to a Labor Compliance Program per Labor Code Section 1771.3. Contractor's on the project will be required to comply with the provisions of the California Labor Code, including, without limitation, Sections 1773.1, 1774, 1775 and 1776 of the California Labor Code and including, without limitation, the obligations to pay the general prevailing rates of wages in the locality in which the Work is to be performed and comply with Section 1777.5 of the California Labor Code governing employment of apprentices.

NOTE: County is also conducting a prequalification for Electronic Security Subcontractors. Bidding for that portion of the Work by any General Contractor will be restricted to the prequalified Electronic Security Subcontractors. General Contractors who wish to self-perform the electronic security trade work shall be required to submit Electronic Security Subcontractors prequalification documents as specified in this prequalification package. County will furnish a list of prequalified Electronic Security Subcontractors in the bidding documents for the Project. Only prequalified Electronic Security Subcontractors will be approved by County for use in the above electronic security portion of the Work.

B. Data Required

All portions of AFP, Parts I through VI, should be completed with additional information attached if the space provided does not suffice. Failure to include the information called for may result in disqualification. It is essential that construction experience of the Contractor be demonstrated, as such experience is considered in establishing prequalification.

NOTE: The pre-qualification packages (questionnaire answers and financial statements) submitted by Contractors are not public records and are not open to public inspection. All information provided will be kept confidential to the extent permitted by law. However, the contents may be disclosed to third parties for purpose of verification, or investigation of substantial allegations, or in the appeal hearing. State law requires that the names of Contractors applying for pre-qualification status shall be public records subject to disclosure, and the first page of the questionnaire will be used for that purpose.

Each questionnaire must be signed under penalty of perjury in the manner designated at the end of the form, by an individual who has the legal authority to bind the Contractor on whose behalf that person is signing. If any information provided by a Contractor becomes inaccurate, the Contractor must immediately notify the County and provide updated accurate information in writing, under penalty of perjury.

The County reserves the right to waive minor irregularities and omissions in the information contained in the AFP submitted, to make all final determinations, and to determine at any time that the pre-qualification procedures will not be applied to a specific future County project.

Contractors shall submit pre-qualification packages during regular working hours on any day that the offices of the EDA are open up to the deadline of -----, local time, -----, 20--.

The County may refuse to grant pre-qualification where the requested information and materials are not provided by the submittal deadline. There is no appeal from a refusal for an incomplete or late application. The closing time for bids will not be changed in order to accommodate supplementation of incomplete submissions, or late submissions.

C. Current Financial Information

Contractor shall provide a complete financial statement indicating organization's financial condition. Financial statements provided by general contractors shall not be older than six (6) months prior to the date the Contractor submits the AFP. The financial statements are to be reviewed or audited, and submitted with any accompanying notes and supplemental information. The County reserves the right to reject financial statements in which the financial condition reported is of a date six (6) months or more prior to the date the AFP is due to County.

D. Accountant's Certificate

The certificate of a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) is required. A suggested form of certificate is included which may be used if applicable. However, the County will accept a submission from the CPA in their own words, including such qualifications as may be necessary in view of the scope of this assignment, provided that such qualifications shall not be so extensive as to nullify the value of the statement or its usefulness to the County. Certificate shall be signed and shall indicate the CPA's license/certificate number.

Bearing in mind that working capital is an important factor in determining the pre-qualification of the general contractor, the accountant will perform a valuable service for their client and at the same time assist the County, if they will furnish, by supplemental schedules or as part of their certificate, any information not specifically called for by the statement which in their opinion might be taken into consideration.

In the event that the general contractor's job income and expenditures are accounted on a completed contract basis and the balance sheet includes an item reflecting the excess of costs to date over billings to date, or vice versa, the elements of "Accumulated Costs" and "Billings to Date" must be shown in support of the balance sheet item.

E. Affidavits

The appropriate affidavit must be completely executed or the application will be disqualified.

F. Questions

General Contractors are required to submit any questions regarding the prequalification process or the contents of the prequalification package in writing no later than -----, local time, -----, 20--. Questions submitted after the deadline will not be accepted or answered. Only written inquiries will be permitted. Only written inquiries will be responded to. Under no circumstance are any prospective general contractors or anyone receiving the prequalification package to contact, discuss with, or inquire of any County consultant, employee, or elected official on any matter relating to this solicitation process. This requirement is to ensure that the same information is communicated to all parties and that no inconsistent, incomplete, or inaccurate information is transmitted separately. County will issue an addendum providing answers/clarifications to all written questions to all parties who have officially obtained/requested the AFP from County EDA, unless the questions pertain to a specific scope of work.

G. Appeal Rights

Where a timely and completed application results in a rating below that necessary to pre-qualify, a Contractor may request a hearing to appeal the decision. An appeal is begun by the Contractor delivering written notice to the County of Contractor's appeal of the decision with respect to its pre-qualification rating, no later than five business days following the date of written notification from the County that the Contractor does not meet the rating established by the County. Without a timely appeal, the Contractor waives any and all rights to challenge the decision of the County, whether by administrative process, judicial process or any other legal process or proceeding. If the Contractor gives the required notice of appeal and requests a hearing, the hearing shall be conducted so that it is concluded no later than ten (10) business days after the County's receipt of the notice of appeal. The hearing shall be an informal process conducted by an Appeals Panel to which the County has delegated responsibility to hear such appeals. At or prior to the hearing, the Contractor will be advised of the basis for the County's pre-qualification determination. The Contractor will be given the opportunity to present information and present reasons to refute the prequalification rating and the reasons therefore. The Contractor may be represented by a person of its choosing. The hearing shall not be conducted according to technical rules relating to evidence and witnesses applicable to judicial proceedings. Any relevant evidence, including hearsay, may be received and considered if it is the sort of evidence on which reasonable persons are accustomed to rely on in the conduct of serious business affairs. The submission of documentary evidence is encouraged. The Appeals Panel shall have the power to limit oral testimony given at the hearing. Within two business days after the conclusion of the hearing, the Appeals Panel will render its decision. A copy of the written decision will be delivered to the Contractor, either personally, by registered mail, certified mail, or electronically if requested in writing by the Contractor. The determination of the Appeals Panel shall be final and not subject to further appeal. It is the intention of the County that the date for the submission and opening of bids will not be delayed or postponed to allow for completion of an appeal process.

(1) Omission of requested information or,
(2) Falsification of information

2. PROJECT OVERVIEW

A. Project Location

The East County Detention Center is located at 46057 Oasis Street, in the City of Indio, in Riverside County, California.

The project delivery method for East County Detention Center project will be through a single prime contract awarded through a Lump Sum bid package. The Project, consisting of two phases, is expected to bid on -----, 2014. The County's estimate of probable construction cost is \$230,000,000 and the anticipated construction duration of both phases combined is 1,110 calendar days.

B. Project Description

The East County Detention Facility will be administered under the State of California's AB900 Program, which is authorized under the State of California Public Safety and Offender Rehabilitation Services Act of 2007 and provides state funded lease-revenue bond financing for construction or expansion of county jails in California.

The Project is to be located on a 7.5 acre site currently occupied by the Indio CAC Building, Courthouses and Jail. The CAC Building, Courthouses and a portion of the Jail will be demolished and the site will be graded in preparation for new facility construction, under a separate contract. The new project will be approximately 600,000 gross square feet and will consist of two phases; Phase1 – Construction of a 4 level Housing Building with an extension to an existing underground tunnel and connecting 3 level (including basement) Support Building and, Phase 2- Demolition of the existing jail and construction of landscape, hardscape and parking. The existing jail will remain operational with temporary support systems while new facility is constructed. Sheriff staff and inmates will relocate to the new facility in the last months of Phase 1, making way for the demolition of the existing jail and subsequent site improvements.

The new facility will be operated by the County of Riverside Sheriff's Department and will house 1626 inmates with support operations including kitchen, medical and administrative services. The facility is designed to maximize security while minimizing staffing requirements utilizing modern electronic security and surveillance systems. The facility will provide video visitation and state-of-the-art telecommunication systems. The Project is funded by the State's AB900 Local Adult Detention Facility Program and the County of Riverside.

3. EVALUATION CRITERIA

Qualifications will include:

- o Evaluation and verification of General Contractor's or entity's current ability and history to secure Liability and Workers' Compensation insurance
- o Evidence and history of proper licensing
- o Ability to secure required bonding
- o Financial ability
- o History of litigation and claims; or other adverse actions
- o Safety record

Experience to be evaluated will include:

- o History of firm/entity
- o Organization of firm/entity
- o Relevant experience of firm/entity
- o Proposed management team for Project and proposed key personnel
- o Experience of proposed key personnel to be assigned to Project
- o Firm's/entity's experience in successfully completing public works projects of similar size, scope and complexity
- o Firm's/entity's experience in the utilization of Building Information Modeling (BIM)

Evaluation of Comparable Project Experience

In addition to above criteria, the Contractor shall provide information for comparable projects, as defined in this AFP.

NOTE: Scoring will be based on submitted comparable projects that meet as many of the following components as possible:

- o Relative projects within the last ten (10) years with a minimum of 150,000 gross square footage and construction costs of at least \$100,000,000.
- o Large, complex, detention facilities
- o Structural Concrete, including Pile, Cast in Place and Panel systems
- o Secure campus facilities
- o Projects with complex interrelated building systems such as security electronics/monitoring and alarm, building and energy management, telecommunications, data distribution and other related sub-systems
- o Building Demolition, remediation and abatement
- o Projects requiring phased completion, providing owner occupancy of completed phase(s) prior to final total project completion
- o Performed construction while an existing on-site facility remains occupied and operational, ensuring non-disruption

Evaluation of Financial Information

In addition to above criteria, the Contractor shall provide financial information, as defined in this AFP.
