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**Impact on Citizens and Businesses**

This project will construct drainage infrastructure to remedy ongoing flooding problems. This project is funded by ad valorem property tax revenue and entails no new fees, taxes or bonded indebtedness. Moreover, this project will enable revision of the FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Maps in the impacted area resulting in a significant reduction in flood insurance premiums. Owners with Federally insured home loans will realize savings of several thousand dollars per year.

**Contract History and Price Reasonableness**

Pursuant to Public Contract Code 21091, invitation of sealed bids was solicited by advertising in print and digital media.

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
