Summary

The Board approved a contract with Mamco, Inc. dba Alabbasi, in the amount of \$824,999 as Agenda Item Number 11-3 on July 2, 2013. The total payment of the contract is \$877,006; this includes the overage due to quantity adjustments and two (2) change orders due to various utility issues and is under the 10% project contingency. The District does not anticipate any claims for additional compensation from the Contractor.

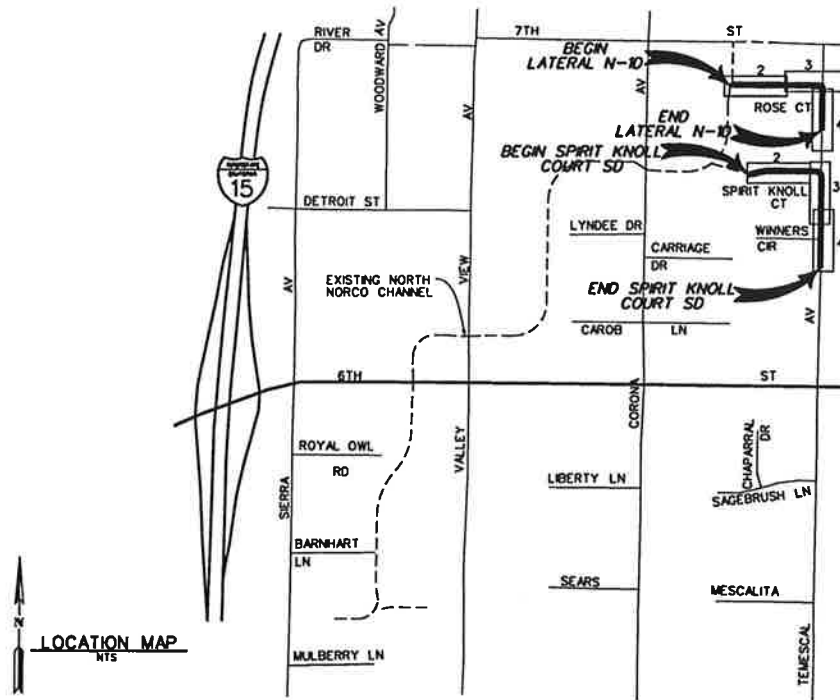

NORCO MDP LATERAL N-1D

NORCO SPIRIT KNOLL COURT SD



Norco MDP Lateral N-1D, Stage 1, is located within the city of Norco, Riverside County, California. The project is an underground system that begins at the existing Norco Channel, travels east approximately 650 feet along Rose Court, turns south and ends approximately 300 feet south of the intersection of Rose Court and Temescal Avenue. This project is proposed to convey the 100-year storm event with catch basins located along Rose Court and Temescal Avenue, between 6th and 7th Streets. The proposed project is approximately 970 lineal feet of 3'Hx5'W reinforced concrete box. The mainline will be maintained and operated by the District; the catch basins will be maintained by the City of Norco.

Norco Spirit Knoll Court Storm Drain, is located within the city of Norco, Riverside County, California. The project is an underground system to convey the 10-year storm event and help alleviate flooding with catch basins located along Temescal Avenue. Spirit Knoll Court lateral is approximately 1,130 lineal feet of reinforced concrete pipe varying in size between elliptical 36-inch equivalent pipe to 18-inch pipe. The system starts at a catch basin located at the end of Spirit Knoll, travels approximately 600 feet east before turning south along Temescal Avenue and terminates approximately at the intersection of Winners Circle and Temescal Avenue. The existing catch basin on Spirit Knoll Court discharges into the interim North Norco Channel. The project will be constructed by the District and operated and maintained by the City of Norco.
