**BACKGROUND:** Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

- 1. Mead Valley Elementary School -\$1,000** funding will be used to help Mead Valley reach their goal of purchasing 40 chrome books for their students in grades 3-5. These chrome books will be used to help students improve their computer skills in preparation for the 2015 Smarter Balanced Assessments.
- 2. City of Riverside-\$1,500** funding will be used to assist with the Riverside Access Center Improvements. The Riverside Access Center currently serves as a Homeless Service Campus that provides a range of supportive services to homeless individuals and those at-risk of homelessness. The City of Riverside is hoping to make improvements to this facility by increasing medical services and adding a shower and laundry facility for homeless clients.
- 3. Canyon Lake Woman's Club -\$1,000** funding will be used to support their Scholarship Program which will award scholarships to Canyon Lake Female residents who are currently in their Senior year of High School.
