#### **BACKGROUND:**

**Summary (continued)** 

Section 76104.6 of the California Government Code established a county DNA Identification Fund for reimbursement of expenditures and administrative costs incurred by the local sheriff or other law enforcement agencies in compliance with Penal Code Section 298.

In general, Proposition 69, as made law in Penal Code Sections 296 (a) and 298, requires law enforcement or custodial agencies, statewide, to collect buccal swab samples, right thumbprints, and a full palm print impression of each hand, and any blood specimens or other biological samples collected from felony arrestees be forwarded promptly to the Department of Justice for law enforcement identification analysis and entry into the Department of Justice DNA Database.

The established budget within the DNA special fund will facilitate the reimbursement of costs related to collecting biological samples from felony booking detainees entering County detention facilities during FY 2013–14.

## Impact on Citizens and Businesses
