A Notice of Intent to Adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration, the Initial Study, and the Mitigated Negative Declaration were made available for a 30-day public review period from March 21, 2014 to April 21, 2014 in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The Notice of Intent was sent to the State Clearinghouse, to interested public agencies and private parties, to responsible agencies, and to the County Clerk. Additionally, the Notice of Intent was posted by the County Clerk for a period of at least 30 days. The Mitigated Negative Declaration will be taken to the Board for adoption on the same date (July 1, 2014) as the Section 18 Public Hearing.

RESOLUTION NO. F2014-09 SETTING A PUBLIC HEARING DATE FOR UNIVERSITY WASH CHANNEL, STAGE 3 PROJECT IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 18 OF THE DISTRICT ACT

WHEREAS, this Board intends to undertake a project within the city of Riverside designated as University Wash Channel, Stage 3 Project ["Proposed Project"]; and

WHEREAS, the Proposed Project is generally bounded to the north by Spruce Street, to the east by Chicago Avenue, to the south by Massachusetts Avenue, and to the west by Kansas Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Proposed Project consists of the installation and subsequent maintenance of approximately 2,500 lineal feet of 90-inch reinforced concrete pipe underground storm drain and associated catch basins, access manholes, street repaving, and grading of approximately two (2) acres; and

WHEREAS, reference is made to the engineering cost estimate for the Proposed Project, entitled "Engineer's Statement" on file with the Clerk of the Board; and

WHEREAS, reference is made to a map dated March 2014, bearing the name and showing the general location and typical section of the Proposed Project which is also on file with the Clerk of the Board; and

WHEREAS, the General Manager-Chief Engineer of the District has found that the Proposed Project will not have a significant adverse effect on the environment and has prepared a Mitigated Negative Declaration in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) which will not become final until adopted by this Board; and

WHEREAS, a Notice of Intent to Adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration, the Initial Study, and the Mitigated Negative Declaration were made available for a 30-day public review period from March 21, 2014 to April 21, 2014; and

1 WHEREAS, a Notice of Intent to Adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration was sent to the
2 State Clearinghouse, to interested public agencies and private parties, to responsible agencies,
3 and to the County Clerk; and

9 writing between the date of this notice and the public hearing, or may appear and be heard at the
10 time and place noted below; and

11 WHEREAS, in a subsequent legal challenge any person may be limited to raising only
12 those issues he, she or someone else raised at the public hearing described in this notice, or in
13 written comments delivered before or at the public hearing; and

14 WHEREAS, prior to making a decision on the Proposed Project, this Board will consider
15 all written and oral comments; and

16 WHEREAS, the Proposed Project's documents may be inspected at the District office
17 located at 1995 Market Street, Riverside, California 92501 and on the District's website at
18 www.rcflood.org and written comments will be received at the above address.

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED by the
20 Board of Supervisors of the Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District in
21 regular session assembled on May 20, 2014 that:

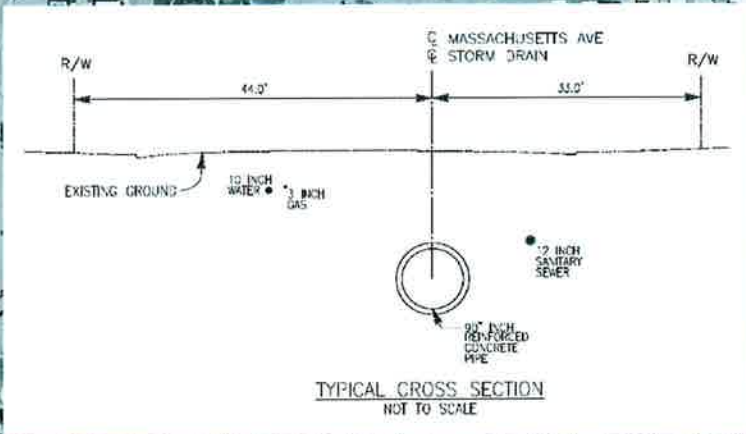
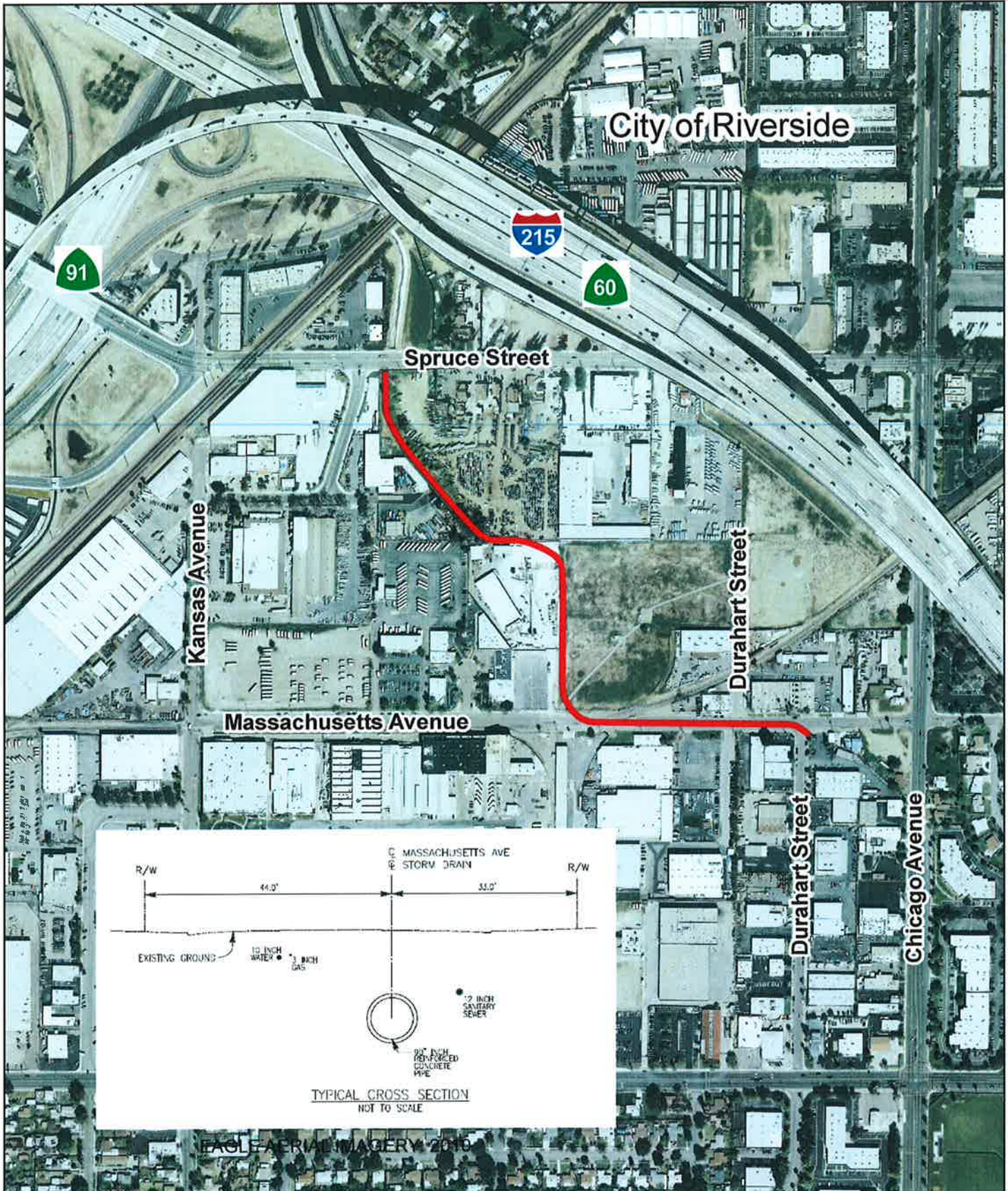
3 2. A copy of this Resolution and copies of the map and Engineer's Statement shall be

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University Wash Channel, Stage 3
Project No. 1-0-00120-03
Engineer's Statement

The proposed University Wash Channel, Stage 3 project is located in the city of Riverside, Riverside County. The project generally bound by Spruce Street to the north, Chicago Avenue to the east, Massachusetts Avenue to the south, and Kansas Avenue to the west. The project will provide 10-year flood protection to the adjacent area and will substantially improve drainage along the project reach during the majority of storm events. Additionally, when ultimately paired with future master planned improvements upstream, the storm drain improvements will provide 100-year flood protection to adjacent properties and public right-of-way.

The project consists of construction and maintenance of approximately 2,500 linear feet (LF) of 90-inch reinforced concrete pipe underground storm drain and associated catch basins, access manholes, street repaving, and grading of approximately 2 acres. The project will begin at the existing box to the Spruce Street Storm Drain on the south side of Spruce Street, then southeast along the alignment of the existing earthen channel approximately 800 LF. The project alignment would extend southerly and easterly for approximately 1,700 LF through several private parcels on which a storm drain easement would be acquired generally parallel to property lines. The alignment would then extend easterly in Massachusetts Avenue, terminating on the east side of Durahart Street adjacent to its intersection with Massachusetts Avenue. The Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District would manage construction and would own, operate, and maintain the storm drain mainline. The City of Riverside would maintain the catch basins (i.e., drain inlets) and connector pipes. The estimated cost of the project is \$2,400,000.
