SUBJECT: Adoption of Resolution #2014-117 Authorizing the Sheriff's Department to Submit a Grant Application to the Board of State and Community Corrections, District 5/5. [\$0]

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Adopt Resolution No. 2014-117, authorizing the Sheriff, Undersheriff, the Assistant Sheriff, or the Chief Deputy to sign and submit a grant application to the Board of State and Community Corrections for \$217,656 to continue the Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) programs in Riverside County;
2. Authorize the Sheriff or designee to administer the grant project, and sign reimbursement requests and future grant amendments or modifications that do not increase the original award by more than 20% and that do not materially change the scope of the grant project.

BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Board of State and Community Corrections is currently accepting applications for its Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) program. Since 2009, annual grant awards from the Bureau of Justice (BJA) have funded substance abuse treatment services in Riverside County.

BACKGROUND:

Summary (continued)

The Sheriff's Department has been operating a successful Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) program at the Larry D. Smith Correctional Facility since October 1998. The program provides both male and female inmates vital substance abuse treatment and is structured to reduce recidivism within the county jail system.

The current grant application will fund year two of a two-year grant cycle, for the RSAT program with a proposed start date of July 1, 2014. The application requests \$217,656 to support one Correctional Counselor and Correctional Deputy for continued substance treatment.

The grant application requires a 25% match of the total project cost of \$290,208 in the amount of \$72,552. The Inmate Welfare Fund committee approved the required 25% grant match that will be used by the Sheriff's Department to offset salaries and benefits. Any grant awarded will be submitted to the Board of Supervisors for review and approval

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The grant funds 75% of total project cost. The grant project focus of the Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) program is to provide in-custody inmates vital substance abuse treatment to reduce recidivism with the county jail system.

11 the Board of State and Community Corrections (hereafter referred to as BSCC);

12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED by the
13 Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California, in regular session
14 assembled on _____ at 9:00 a.m. in the meeting room of the Board of Supervisors,
15 located on the 1st floor of the County Administrative Center, 4080 Lemon Street, Riverside, CA,
16 that the Board of Supervisors does hereby approve the filing of an Application for a grant award
17 under the Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) for State Prisoners Program;

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Sheriff, the Undersheriff, the Assistant
19 Sheriff or the Chief Deputy are authorized as agents to conduct all negotiations, execute and
20 submit all documents including, but not limited to applications, award agreements, amendments
21 not increasing the award by more than 20% and that do not materially change the scope of the
22 grant project, and payment requests which may be necessary for completion of the project;

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the federal grant funds received hereunder
24 shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body;

25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Riverside County agrees, upon acceptance of
26 a grant award, to provide all matching funds required for said project and abide by the statutes
