# BACKGROUND:

## **Summary (continued)**

the construction of a biomass energy plant near the unincorporated community of Mecca in the southern Coachella Valley. Riverside County administers the Coachella Valley Air Quality Enhancement Trust Fund. Funds can only be used for projects which enhance the Coachella Valley air quality.

Through a competitive application process, the County uses these funds to support programs that enhance air quality in the Coachella Valley. The Coachella Valley Air Quality Enhancement Program funding project period will begin July 1, 2014.

#### **Impact on Citizens and Businesses**

Citizens and businesses will see a marked improvement in the air quality.

#### <u>Contract History and Price Reasonableness</u>

Purchasing released Request for Application (RFA) PUARC-1358 via a posting on the Riverside County Purchasing & Fleet Service's website. A total of seven applications were received from the following applicants:

The Coachella Valley Air Quality Advisory Committee (CVAQAC), comprising the Fourth District County Supervisor, representatives from the Coachella Valley Association of Governments (CVAG) and the South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD), reviewed all applications to determine responsiveness as follows:

#### **PROJECT CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS:**

- a) Projects must enhance air quality within the Coachella Valley region.
- b) Restricted to non-profit organizations, school districts and special districts.
- c) Grant funds may not be used to sustain either the administrative or other ongoing costs of existing projects.
- d) The awarded funds are to be used for, but are not limited to, start-up costs of new projects or expansion of current projects.
- e) Applications must include documentation of the expected air quality enhancement(s) (e.g., vehicle trip reduction, reduction in PM-10, etc.) resulting from the proposed project.
- f) Matching funds are not required.
- g) All awarded projects are required to submit quarterly reports during the term of the contract. A final report is required at project completion. Only Applications specifically stating that the applicant will meet these requirements will be considered for funding.

h) All funds must be spent during a one year period from the date of contract implementation. The billing for services/supplies as outlined in the contract must occur within three months following the end of the one year project period. Contract extensions must be made no later than the first month of the fourth quarter of the project.

The CVAG trust fund has \$450,000 available for allocation for projects. However, the seven applicants total award amount is \$316,500. The evaluation committee reviewed the applications and determined that all seven applicants meet the above criteria and recommends awarding to all applicants.
