**BACKGROUND:** Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. **Riverside Transit Agency-\$300** to assist with the luncheon costs of the Transportation Now Meetings. These funds will assist with providing lunch for three meetings that the general public is welcome to attend.
2. **Smooth Transitions - \$7,000** ST will be assisting the 1<sup>st</sup> District purchase and distribution frozen turkeys purchased from Sysco to residents in need throughout the 1<sup>st</sup> District. The turkeys will be distributed through the following nonprofits: Bryant Park, Casa Blanca Home of Neighborly Service, Community Settlement Association, Helping People of Elsinore, Janet Goeske Center, Latnet- Centro de Ninos, Newman Center, Queens of Angels, The Concerned Family, Whiteside Manor, and Wildomar Senior. Smooth Transitions will be responsible for the actual purchase and storage of the turkeys until the other non-profits arrange their own pick-up and distribution to their communities, as well as providing a turkey meal for Seniors at the Mead Valley Community Center for Thanksgiving.
3. **Santa Rosa Plateau Nature Education Foundation - \$3,000** Funding will be used to support the "No Child Left Inside" Environment Education Program which teaches students about unique plants, animals and habitats at the Santa Rosa Plateau Ecological Reserve. Over 8,000 students from 10 school districts in grades 3-12 participate in this educational program.
