BACKGROUND: CONTINUED:

- 1. Temecula Preparatory School- \$1,000-** for the rainbow trout outdoor classroom for the school-wide science, technology, engineering, arts and math, (STEAM) project. The objectives of the project are to increase student achievement in science by 5% annually and to increase community awareness of water resource management and conservation.
- 2. Boys & Girls of Southwest County- \$10,000** for Project Learn which provides one mandatory hour each day, for each child to have a healthy snack, to work with a trained professional youth tutors they complete homework and review for an exam, work on a school assigned projects. Specifically these funds are for scholarships for children in military families to participate with Project Learn.
- 3. Great Oak Academic Leadership Society / The Spirit of Great Oak Marching Band & Guard- \$5,000-** The funding awarded will provide scholarships for students to extend beyond their community and experience increased awareness of others and provide a cultural norm of their own to the audiences of Paris France and to those watching the broadcast worldwide. The experience will provide the performers with skills and team building leadership, consistent with what independent teams, colleges and employers seek in the leaders of tomorrow.
- 4. Habitat for Humanity Inland Valley-\$1,000-** Christmas Tree Lane Fundraiser of Southwest County funds the "Brush with Kindness Program" that assists many elderly and low income homeowners with much needed minor home repairs such as grab bars and wheelchair ramps.
