### BACKGROUND: Summary (continued)

# CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE FOR MOUNT SAN JACINTO WINTER PARK AUTHORITY

### (Amended October 21, 2014)

The Political Reform Act (Gov. Code § 81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code of Regs. § 18730) which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code, which can be incorporated by reference in an agency's code. After public notice and hearing it may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations section 18730 and any amendments to it, duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, are hereby incorporated by reference. This incorporation page, regulation and the attached Appendix designating positions and establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the conflict of interest code of the **Mount San Jacinto Winter Park Authority** (the "**Authority**").

All officials and designated positions required to submit a statement of economic interests shall file their statements with the Vice President of Human Resources and Risk Management as the Authority's Filing Officer. The Vice President of Human Resources and Risk Management shall make and retain a copy of all statements filed by Members of the Board of Directors and the other Authority Officials filing under Gov. Code § 87200, and forward the originals of such statements to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside. The Vice President of Human Resources and Risk Management shall retain the originals of the statements filed by all other officials and designated positions and make all statements available for public inspection and regular business hours. # PART "A"

### OFFICIALS WHO MANAGE PUBLIC INVESTMENTS

Authority Officials who manage public investments, as defined by 2 Cal. Code of Regs. § 18701(b), are NOT subject to the Authority's Code but are subject to the disclosure requirements of the Act. (Government Code Section 87200 et seq.). [Regs. § 18730(b)(3)] These positions are listed here for informational purposes only.

The General Manager may determine that, due to the range of duties or contractual obligations, it is more appropriate to assign a limited disclosure requirement. A clear explanation of the duties and a statement of the extent of the disclosure requirements must be in a written document. (Gov. Code Sec. 82019; FPPC Regulations 18219 and 18734.). The General Manager's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this Conflict of Interest Code. (Gov. Code Sec. 81008.)

Consultants and New Positions<sup>2</sup>

Individuals providing services as a Consultant defined in Regulation 18701, or in a new position created since this Code was last approved that makes or participates in making decisions shall disclose pursuant to the broadest disclosure category in this Code subject to the following limitation:

# PART "B"

### **DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES**

The disclosure categories listed below identify the types of investments, business entities, sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, or real property which the Designated Position must disclose for each disclosure category to which he or she is assigned.<sup>3</sup> Such economic interests are reportable if they are either located in or doing business in the jurisdiction, are planning to do business in the jurisdiction, or have done business during the previous two years in the jurisdiction of the Authority.

<u>Category 1</u>: All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income including gifts, loans, and travel payments, that are located in, do business in, or own real property within the jurisdiction of the Authority.

<u>Category 2</u>: All interests in real property which is located in whole or in part within, or not more than two (2) miles outside, the jurisdiction of the Authority.

<u>Category 3</u>: All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income including gifts, loans, and travel payments, that are engaged in land development, construction or the acquisition or sale of real property within the jurisdiction of the Authority.

<u>Category 4</u>: All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, from, banking, savings and loan, or other financial institutions.

<u>Category 5</u>: All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, that provide services, supplies, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the Authority.

<u>Category 6</u>: All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, that provide services, supplies, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the Designated Position's Department, Unit or Division.

This Conflict of Interest Code does not require the reporting of gifts from outside this agency's jurisdiction if the source does not have some connection with or bearing upon the duties or functions of the position (Reg 187630.1).
