BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Board approved a contract with Mamco, Inc. dba Alabbasi, in the amount of \$1,479,749 as Agenda Item Number 11-2 on March 11, 2014. The total payment of the contract is \$1,536,894. This includes the overage due to quantity adjustments, which totals 3.86% and is under the 10% project contingency. The District does not anticipate any claims for additional compensation from the Contractor. This project is a joint project between the District and the City of Jurupa Valley.

BACKGROUND:

Summary (continued)

Final inspection of the above referenced project was made, and the project was found to be complete according to plans and specifications. A brief project description and location map are attached.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

This project initially began as a joint project between the District and the County Redevelopment Agency (RDA). The District and the City of Jurupa Valley felt that this project was vital to the residents, therefore, we worked together to complete a portion of the project when RDA funding was eliminated by the State of California.

This project intercepts flows from smaller storm events in Pyrite Channel before it flows through an unimproved segment of wash in a residential area prone to flooding and redirects them to the District's existing concrete lined Jurupa Channel. Jurupa Channel returns the low flows to the natural wash after it has bypassed the flood prone residential area. It also included curb, gutter and new pavement along Pyrite Street.

Contract History and Price Reasonableness


Pursuant to Public Contract Code 21091, invitation of sealed bids was solicited by advertising in print and digital media.

Pursuant to the cooperative agreement executed May 14, 2013 (Item 11-2), the City of Jurupa Valley will reimburse the District for the actual construction cost of certain street improvements. Said actual cost was \$279,807 resulting in a net District cost of \$1,257,087 (reflected in the Financial Data field on Page 1 of this Form 11).

PYRITE CHANNEL BYPASS, PYRITE ST. STORM DRAIN, STG. 1 PROJECT NO. 1-0-00109



Pyrite Channel Bypass, Pyrite St. Storm Drain, Stage 1, is a 1700 foot underground storm drain within the City of Jurupa Valley. The drain connects Pyrite Storm Drain upstream of Pyrite Street to Jurupa Channel. The project also includes curb, gutter and new pavement along Pyrite Street. The proposed storm drain would intercept low flows in Pyrite Channel before it flows through a residential area prone to flooding and redirects it to the District's existing concrete lined Jurupa Channel. Jurupa Channel returns the low flows to the natural wash after it has bypassed the flood prone residential area.
