BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

- 1. Casa Blanca Home of Neighborly Service \$2,500 funding will be used to support programs in the community including a Computer Literacy Lab Program which will provide ESL classes to adults in the community.
- 2. Janet Goeske Foundation \$5,000 funding will be used to support ongoing senior services programs at the Janet Goeske Center where they provided services to seniors 7 days a week.
- 3. Canyon Lake Women's Club \$1,000 funding will be used to support their Scholarship Program which will award scholarships to Canyon Lake Female residents who are currently in their Senior year of High School.
- 4. City of Lake Elsinore Clean Extreme \$2,000 funding will be used to support the purchase of supplies and materials for improvements for a large community clean up on April 25, 2015. The Clean Extreme committee will have an estimated 750 volunteers that will be working with the County Parks departments to clean up Butterfield Stage Elementary which will soon be a community center for the residents in the area.
