BACKGROUND:

Summary

On April 22, 2014, (3.66), the Board of Supervisors approved a three (3) year sole source agreement with Helistream Incorporated to provide initial, recurrence, high altitude, turbine and night vision goggle flight training for pilots assigned to the Sheriff's Department Aviation Unit. The Form 11 specified \$50,000 would be used in the remainder of FY13/14 and \$100,000 for each FY thereafter until June 30, 2017.

In FY 14/15, a tenured pilot was unable to return to flight status after suffering a work related injury. In order to meet the staffing needs of the Department and the Aviation Unit, it was necessary to train a replacement pilot. Due to this unexpected pilot training the department has incurred additional training costs in excess of the current year purchase order. The Sheriff is requesting a \$50,000 increase to the Helistream Incorporated purchase order for a total of \$150,000 in FY 14/15, to pay for outstanding invoices.

This increase in training costs will be taken from the existing Class 2 budget and therefor no budget adjustment is necessary.

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

County citizens and businesses benefit from the skills of well-trained helicopter pilots providing aerial law enforcement support and search and rescue missions. Of further benefit, is the Department's access to a local training center that provides lower-cost training in the same aircraft that Department pilots fly daily.
