BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Department of Environmental Health has provided vector control services to the unincorporated areas of the County since 1972. Due to loss of general fund support over the past decade, the Department is seeking a sustainable funding source in order to continue the vector control program. The proposed benefit assessment is consistent with funding measures for vector control and mosquito abatement districts across California.

BACKGROUND:

Summary (continued)

On May 12, 2015, the Board adopted Resolution 2015-111 (Proposition 218 ballot proceedings and the mailing of assessment ballots) and 2015-112 (initiating proceedings and providing notice of intention to levy special assessments and preliminarily approving engineer's report). Ballots were mailed to all parcel owners within the central/western unincorporated service areas on May 22, 2015.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Authorization to vote for these county owned parcels will not have a substantial impact on residents and businesses. The potential ongoing cost for continued vector control services to county-owned parcels is minimal.
