BACKGROUND:

- 1. Senior Citizens Service Center \$ 2,000 The funding will provide food purchase for residents referred by the Department of Social Services and families in need of food supplies.
- 2. Boy Scouts of America, California Inland Empire Council \$2,500 The funds will be utilized for the creation of new scouting units, and scholarships for camp.
- 3. City of Temecula and Community Mission of Hope \$6,000 Provides inclement weather shelter program through a partnership with the City of Temecula, Community Mission of Hope, Project Touch and private donors to offer families emergency housing during 2015-2016 winter season.
- 4. Calicinto Ranch Inc. \$5,000 The funding will provide camp scholarships for ages 7-17 who are a part of the incarcerated prevention program for prisoner's children. The camp provides an educational understanding of farm life, animal care and honor towards others. An integral part of the camp program is the law enforcement personnel interaction which helps to break down the wall of resistance to authority while building positive character traits of respect.
