**RESOLUTION NO. 2015-256** 

## RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE EXTENDING THE EXISTENCE OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 8630, Article 14, of the California Emergency Services Act requires that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside review, at least every thirty (30) days until such Local Emergency is terminated, the need for continuing the Local Emergency; and

WHEREAS, a period of Local Emergency presently exists in the County of Riverside in accordance with the proclamation thereof by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, by Resolution No. 2015-195, on August 18, 2015, as a result of conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within said county, caused by a severe microburst which took place in the unincorporated area of Thermal, within the County of Riverside, creating winds in excess of 70 mph, producing rainfall, hail, lightning strikes, and damage to personal property and cirtical infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside has reviewed the need to continue the existence of the Local Emergency; and

WHEREAS, the situation resulting from said condition of extreme peril is still deemed to be beyond the control of normal protective service, personnel, equipment, and facilities of and within said County of Riverside; now, therefore,

**BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside does hereby proclaim the extension of the period of Local Emergency for thirty (30) additional days unless sooner terminated.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that said Local Emergency shall be deemed to continue to exist until its termination is proclaimed by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside.
