

BACKGROUND: Community Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. Time is Creeping Up Productions (TICUP)—funding will support a Christmas dinner to 350-500 foster youth in the Riverside Department of Social Service Foster Care System.
2. Family Service Association—annual funding will support programs and services provided to the needy youth, seniors and families of Cabazon and surrounding communities of the fifth district.
3. Menifee Valley Chamber of Commerce—annual funding will support their economic development, programs and services provided to the community and small businesses.
4. Banning Cultural Alliance—annual funding will be allocated for a variety of art and cultural programs in the Pass Area with a focus on underserved families
