SUBJECT: Expansion of Department of Waste Resources IMPACT Program, All Districts [\$50,000 -Waste Resources Enterprise Funds]

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board authorize the General Manager-Chief Engineer to fund bin rentals or waive disposal fees up to \$10,000 per year for each supervisorial district to augment existing community cleanups required under solid waste collection franchise agreements.

BACKGROUND:

The existing solid waste franchise collection agreements require private haulers to have, at no charge, community cleanups in each franchise area every year. In recent years, community cleanups have been very successful and staff believes that each Supervisorial District could benefit by also offering targeted cleanups to assist with beautification, flood prevention, and other waste mitigation concerns. By authorizing up to 20 additional bins per year or equivalent disposal fee waivers in each district (approximately \$10,000/year per District) a significant and sustainable effort could be made towards the improvement in the quality of life of communities within Riverside County.
