Summary

BACKGROUND:

Summary (continued)

RCRMC had two primary goals in seeking limited delegation authority. The primary objective was to reduce the time normally required to finalize an agreement. Typical agreements might provide equipment for patient service, initiate student internships, or they might generate net new revenue. In each case there is a sizable benefit to expediting the approval process. The secondary objective was to remove items that are repetitive or routine and thus help declutter the Board agenda.

During the second quarter many beneficial agreements have been signed, including five affiliation agreements with universities to provide training to students and physicians, three grants totaling \$1.5 million in revenue, and three participation agreements with various entities like the California Department of Health Care Services for a supplemental reimbursement program.

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

Delegated authority allows for patient services to be delivered faster. Those agreements that increase revenue or accelerate payments improve the hospital's fiscal health.
