BACKGROUND:

Summary

The County of Riverside Transportation Department (Transportation Department) utilizes outside consulting firms to assist in the environmental phase of project delivery, often the critical path, to supplement our own Transportation Department staff, and make use of specialized expertise for certain environmental studies. Environmental Services are needed to provide access to additional expertise and personnel, enabling the Transportation Department to meet increasing state and federal regulatory compliance demands.

On October 18, 2011 (Agenda Item 3-38), the Board of Supervisors (Board) approved the On-Call Environmental Services Agreement with ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc. with an annual amount not-to-exceed \$250,000. The On-call Environmental Agreement was for a 3-year term with the option to extend the contract two (2) additional one (1) year terms following the close of the initial three (3) year term.

On July 1, 2014 (Agenda Item 3-59), the Board approved Amendment No.1 which provided ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc. the first of two optional one-year extensions in the amount of \$250,000 for FY 2014/2015 and authorized the Director of Transportation to approve future extensions as provided for in the agreement. On June 30, 2015 (Agenda Item 3-65) the Board approved Amendment No. 2 which revised the annual budget in the agreement for FY 2015/2016 from \$250,000 per year to \$500,000 per year. The revision was necessary due to an increased amount of project activities requiring efficient and timely environmental analysis. On June 3, 2015, the Director of Transportation approved Amendment No. 3 which provided a second and final one-year extension.

The \$500,000 budget for Fiscal Year 2015/2016 for ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc. has been exhausted. The budget must be increased to provide sufficient capacity to continue working on critical on-call work assignments for necessary environmental services. There is a need for environmental services for the mitigation, monitoring and construction permitting of the Clinton Keith Road Extension Project, ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc. is also performing environmental clearances of the Interim Safety project located on Cajalco Road that will add wider shoulders, continuous left-turn lane, bus turn outs, and additional lanes at the intersection between Day Street and Brown Street. In addition, the Planning Department is utilizing the services of ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc. to assist the Environmental Programs section. Amendment No. 4 will increase the contract budget amount an additional \$500,000 for a total of \$1,000,000 for the remainder of Fiscal Year 2015/2016 which will allow for environmental analysis to continue in an efficient and expedient manner.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

This amendment will provide increased access to specific environmental expertise in areas that will supplement Transportation and Planning Department staff resources, keeping Transportation projects moving and assisting Planning's development review functions.

SUPPLEMENTAL:

Additional Fiscal Information

All associated contract costs will be funded using project funds. Project funds include, but are not limited to, Measure A, Gas Tax, WRCOG TUMF, Road and Bridge Benefit District funds, developer contributions and various State funds. Deposit based fees are utilized in funding a consultant to support the Environmental Programs section of the Planning Department. Thus, no net County costs will be incurred as a result of this contract agreement.

(hereinafter “CONSULTANT”).

RECITALS

- A. COUNTY and CONSULTANT have entered into an Agreement entitled “On-Call Environmental Services between County of Riverside – Transportation Department and ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc.” dated October 18, 2011, Agenda Item 3.38 (hereinafter the “Agreement”). The Agreement provides the terms and conditions, scope of work, schedule and budget for the performance of professional and technical services necessary to provide on-call Environmental services.
- B. Due to an increased amount of roadway activities requiring varying levels of environmental analysis and on-call Environmental services provided to other COUNTY departments, the amount of compensation is required to be increased a second time to provide sufficient funding capacity for efficient and timely environmental analysis. The parties augmented the compensation amount on June 30, 2015 in an amendment entitled “Amendment No. 2 to Agreement for On-call Environmental Services between County of Riverside-Transportation Department and ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc” (Amendment No. 2), Agenda Item 3-65. The parties now desire to amend the compensation amount for the remainder of Fiscal Year 2015/2016.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter contained, the parties agree as follows, effective as of this _____ day of _____, 2015:

- 1. Article VI – COMPENSATION subsection B.1. of the original Agreement was amended by Amendment No. 2 on June 30, 2015 (Agenda Item 3-65) by deleting the sentence “The total amount of the Contract is not to exceed \$250,000 per year.” and replacing with the following: “The total amount of the Contract is

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not to exceed \$500,000 per year.” Amendment No. 4 is amending the previously amended Agreement language with the following: “The total amount of the contract is not to exceed \$1,000,000”.

2. Appendix C · Article CIV · Cost Proposal of the original Agreement was amended by Amendment No. 2 on June 30, 2015 (Agenda Item 3-65) by deleting the Annual Budget Amount for July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016 of “\$250,000” and replacing with “\$500,000”. Amendment No. 4 is amending the “\$500,000” with “\$1,000,000”.
3. CONSULTANT agrees to bill at rates approved in the October 28, 2011 Agreement, for the term of this agreement.
4. Except to the extent specifically modified or amended hereunder, all of the terms, covenants and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect between the parties hereto.

THIS AMENDMENT (hereinafter the "Amendment") to an agreement is made and entered into as of this 1st day of July, 2015, by and between the County of Riverside, a political subdivision of the State of California (hereinafter the "COUNTY"), and ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc. (hereinafter "CONSULTANT").

RECITALS

- A. COUNTY and CONSULTANT have entered in an agreement entitled "On-Call Environmental Services between County of Riverside – Transportation Department and ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc." that is dated October 18, 2011 (hereinafter the "Agreement"). The Agreement provides the terms and conditions, scope of work, schedule and budget for the performance of professional and technical services necessary to provide on-call Environmental services.
- B. Appendix B • Article BI establishes the time period for allowing work assignments to be authorized under the original agreement. The terms and conditions specify that work assignments can be authorized for three years from the date of Board of Supervisors agreement approval (October 18, 2011) and that the authority to execute work assignments can be modified through one-year supplemental extensions. The agreement allows for two separate one-year extensions. The CONSULTANT is satisfactorily performing the duties under this agreement and the Transportation Department continues to need the services provided. The parties therefore now desire to implement the second one-year extension of the authority to execute work assignments.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter contained, the parties agree as follows, effective July 1, 2015:

1. CONSULTANT agrees to bill at the rates approved in the October 18, 2011 Agreement, for the term of this agreement.
2. The authority to authorize work assignments under this contract is hereby extended from July 1, 2015 to

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June 30, 2016 in accordance with Appendix B • Article BI of the original agreement.

3. Except to the extent specifically modified or amended hereunder, all of the terms, covenants and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect between the parties hereto.

The Transportation Department utilizes outside consulting firms to assist in the environmental phase of project delivery, often the critical path, to supplement the currently available minimal Transportation Department staff, and make use of specialized expertise for certain environmental studies.

On October 18, 2011, Agenda Item 3-38, the Board of Supervisors (Board) approved the On-Call Environmental Services Agreement with ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc. Jones & Stokes, Inc. specializes in all phases of cultural and paleontological field investigations, site testing, and analysis and construction monitoring. This existing contract is for an annual not to exceed amount of \$250,000 annually for fiscal years 2011/2012 through 2014/2015. Amendment No. 2 exercises the option to extend the contract for one final year through June 20, 2016, and with a not to exceed budget of \$500,000.

The Cajalco Road Safety Project and the Clinton Keith Extension are two key projects that will benefit from this contract. In addition, the Planning Department is utilizing the services of ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc. to assist with the General Plan and other planning work. The contract Amendment No. 2 will allow for the environmental analysis of road improvements to continue in an efficient and expedient manner.

The Transportation Departments needs the continued environmental support services to deliver all of the necessary road improvement projects identified and funded in the Transportation Improvement Project (TIP).



BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Transportation Department needs the continued environmental support services to deliver all of the necessary road improvement projects identified and funded in the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Environmental services are needed to provide access to expertise and additional personnel, enabling the Transportation Department to meet increasing state and federal regulatory compliance demands.

The Board of Supervisors approved and executed an agreement between the County of Riverside (County) and ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc. on October 18, 2011 (Agenda Item 3-38), to provide the Transportation Department with the needed environmental services. The agreement allowed for two optional one-year extensions to extend the term of the contract.

This extension exercises the option in the agreement to extend the term of the contract for the first of the two optional one-year extensions. The Transportation Department needs the continued services of ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc. for fiscal year 2014/2015.

The terms of the agreement also provide the County the option to terminate the agreement within 30 days without cause.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

This extension will afford the Transportation Department the ability to respond in a time efficient manner to public demands on our road system, as well as obtaining specific environmental expertise in areas that will supplement Transportation Department staff resources.

Additional Fiscal Information

All associated contract costs will be funded using project funds. Thus, no net county costs will be incurred as a result of this contract agreement.

Contract History and Price Reasonableness

The billing rates for environmental services from ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc. remain unchanged from the billing rates included in their October 18, 2011, County-awarded contract. The billing rates for ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc. are comparable to those of other consulting firms offering similar services. ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc. has spent \$177,042.89 to date in FY 13/14 under this contract.

RECITALS

- A. COUNTY and CONSULTANT have entered in an agreement entitled "On-Call Environmental Services between County of Riverside – Transportation Department and ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc." that is dated October 18, 2011 (hereinafter the "Agreement"). The Agreement provides the terms and conditions, scope of work, schedule and budget for the performance of professional and technical services necessary to provide on-call Environmental services.
- B. Appendix B • Article BI establishes the time period for allowing work assignments to be authorized under the original agreement. The terms and conditions specify that work assignment can be authorized for three years from the date of Board of Supervisors agreement approval (October 18, 2011) and that the authority to execute work assignments can be modified through one-year supplemental extensions. The agreement allows for two separate one-year extensions. The CONSULTANT is satisfactorily performing the duties under this agreement and the Transportation Department continues to need the services provided. The parties therefore now desire to implement the first one-year extension of the authority to execute work assignments.



projects in the TIP, new projects continue to surface. Environmental services are needed to provide access to expertise and additional personnel, enabling the Transportation Department to meet increasing State and Federal regulatory compliance demands.

A request for proposals (RFP) was advertised in the Press Enterprise and The Desert Sun for full service firms and specialist firms (Cultural Studies and other work). A notice was mailed to 235 firms that were on the County of Riverside's Pre-Qualified List of Consulting firms. Twenty six (26) firms submitted proposals. The written proposals were evaluated by representatives from the Riverside County Transportation Department. Five (5) full services firms and one (1) specialist (cultural/paleontological) firm were prequalified to provide environmental consulting services for the County.

ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc. (ICF) has been selected to provide on-call services. ICF is able to provide a range of environmental services from field surveys and analysis (e.g. noise, biology, GIS) to document writing. ICF has extensive experience with transportation projects under state and federal standards. ICF will be directed to furnish specific project related environmental tasks to support County staff with the delivery of approved TIP projects. This contract is for an annual amount not-to-exceed \$250,000. It is for a 3-year term (total aggregate of \$750,000). The County has the option to extend the contract for two (2) additional one (1) year terms following the close of the initial three (3) year term. Funding for the services provided for each assignment will come from the respective project funds. These on-call environmental services will afford the Department the ability to respond in a time efficient manner to public demands on our road system, as well as obtaining specific environmental expertise in areas that will supplement our staff resources.

The terms of the agreement also provide the County the option to terminate the agreement within 30 days without cause.
