BACKGROUND:

Summary

The California Department of Parks and Recreation is currently accepting grant applications for its Off-Highway Vehicle Enforcement Program. Since 2002, annual grant award from the Off-Highway Vehicle Enforcement Program has funded OHV law enforcement efforts in Riverside County.

The Riverside Off-Highway Vehicle Enforcement Program (R.O.V.E.), is the Sheriff's innovative and effective program that has put Deputies on all-terrain vehicles (ATVs) to enforce laws concerning illegal off-highway driving and environmental destruction.

The current application will begin Phase XIII of the Sheriff's county-wide effort with a proposed start date of August 2016. The application requests \$156,920 to support Deputy Sheriff overtime for continued and expanded patrols in problematic areas.

The grant application is an estimated request to the California Department of Parks and Recreation and this process requires adoption of a resolution. Once the grant is awarded to Riverside County Sheriff Department another Form 11 will be submitted to the board for approval to accept the grant award and add budget adjustments at that time.

During the development of this phase of the county-wide project, the Sheriff has requested public comment via a posting on the Department's web site.

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

The Parks and Recreation grant allows the Sheriff Department to continue enforcement of laws concerning unlawful intrusions on private and public lands and protected habitats.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE AUTHORIZING SUBMITTAL OF A GRANT APPLICATION FOR STATE OF CALIFORNIA, DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION, OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM FUNDS - LAW ENFORCEMENT AND EQUIPMENT

WHEREAS, The people of the State of California have enacted the Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation Act of 2003, which provides funds to the State of California and its political subdivisions for Acquisition Projects, Conservation Projects, Development Projects, Facilities Operation and Maintenance Projects, Law Enforcement Projects OHV Safety and/or Education Program Projects, Planning Projects, Restoration Projects, and Trail Maintenance Projects for off-highway vehicle recreation; and

WHEREAS, the Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation Division with the California Department of Parks and Recreation has been delegated the responsibility to administer the program; and

WHEREAS, procedures established by the California Department of Parks and Recreation require the Applicant's Governing Body to certify by resolution the approval of the Application to apply for Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Grant funds; and

WHEREAS, this Project appears on, or is in conformance with this jurisdiction's adopted general or master plan and is compatible with the land use plans of those jurisdictions immediately surrounding the Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California, in regular session assembled on at 9:00 a.m. in the meeting room of the Board of Supervisors, located on the 1st

floor of the County Administrative Center, 4080 Lemon Street, Riverside, CA, approves the filing of an Application(s) for an Off-Highway Vehicle Grant or Cooperative Agreement and;

- Certifies that Riverside County understands its legal obligations to the State upon approval of the Grant; and
- Certifies that Riverside County understands the California Public Resources Code requirement that Acquisition and Development Projects be maintained to specific conservation standards; and
- 3. Certifies that the Project will be well-maintained during its useful life; and
- Certifies that Riverside County will implement the Project with diligence once funds are available and the Applicant has reviewed, understands, and agrees with the Project Agreement; and
- 5. Certifies that the County will provide the required Matching Funds (as applicable) in the event that it accepts the award; and
- Certifies that the public and adjacent property owners have been notified of this Project (as applicable); and
- 7. Appoints the Sheriff, Undersheriff, Assistant Sheriff or Chief Deputy Sheriff as agent to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents including, but not limited to applications, award agreements, amendments not increasing the award by more than 20% and that do not materially change the scope of the grant project, and payment requests which may be necessary for completion of the Project.
