BACKGROUND:

Summary

The purpose of this project is to provide a safer pedestrian and bicycle path for travel to and from the Glen Avon Elementary School. Pyrite Street is an existing major arterial facility (two lanes in each direction) and lacks continuous curb, gutter and sidewalk on both sides between Mission Boulevard and Galena Street.

The proposed improvements on Pyrite Street will extend the existing curb, gutter and sidewalk on the east side of the street from its existing limit just north of Glen Avon Elementary School to Mission Boulevard and install a new sidewalk on the west side of the street between Mission Boulevard and Galena Street. Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant ramps at all intersections along the project will be installed and enhanced crosswalk at the intersection of Pyrite Street and Cassidy Circle will be constructed, including solar LED flashers and pedestrian push buttons.

In August 2014 the city of Jurupa Valley successfully competed to receive Alternative Transportation Program (ATP) funds for this project. Although the project is located within the City of Jurupa Valley (City), the City does not have authority to administer federally funded projects because the City does not have the required Master Agreement with the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) in place. The County of Riverside (County) agreed to act as the lead agency on behalf of the City for the overall administration, development and implementation of the project construction. On March 24, 2015 (Agenda Item 3-38), the Board of Supervisors (Board) approved the Cooperative Agreement between the County and the City for Pyrite Street Sidewalk Improvement Project.

The allocation of State construction funds by the California Transportation Commission (CTC) is expected to be approved at its March 17, 2016 meeting.

A funding agreement between the City of Jurupa Valley and the County of Riverside, which will provide for funding by the City, will be brought forth prior to or concurrent with the award of this project.

The County of Riverside Transportation Department (Transportation Department) desires Board authorization to begin advertising for bids, subject to CTC approval of funds, as soon as possible after the March 17, 2016 CTC meeting.

The submitted plans and specifications have been approved as to form by County Counsel, and the CEQA environmental clearance has been completed and posted with the County Clerk by the City of Jurupa Valley.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The proposed improvements will improve pedestrian safety, reduce traffic congestion, and enhance operational efficiency around Glen Avon Elementary School that is consistent with the City's General Plan Circulation Element.

The work is scheduled to begin in June 2016. The work will be phased to keep the road open during construction and will take approximately two months to complete. The Contractor will be required to coordinate the construction with the City of Jurupa Valley, Jurupa Unified School District and the Postmaster for mail delivery.

SUPPLEMENTAL:

Additional Fiscal Information

In addition to City of Jurupa Valley local funds, this sidewalk project will receive State Active Transportation Program (ATP) funds. The City was awarded the ATP funds through a statewide competitive process. The construction contract is estimated to cost approximately \$650,000. Construction is expected to finish in August 2016. There are no General Funds used in this project.



8.	Reason why pro	ject was exempt:	The walkway in many areas is dirt and does not provide curb and gutter. The proposed curb and gutter will tie into the existing storm drain system. This project will enhance the safety of all pedestrians entering and exiting this school zone while involving negligible or no expansion of the existing use. In accordance with Section 7.3.4 of the Western Riverside County MSHCP, necessary operation and maintenance activities conducted for safety purposes along existing roadways are considered a covered activity, and are not subject to survey or mitigation requirements outside Criteria Areas and Public/Quasi Public Lands. The City of Jurupa Valley Staff conducted a review of the above referenced project and has determined that the proposals qualify for a Categorical Exemption per the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines as set forth in section 15301(c).

Each bid shall be in accordance with plans, specifications and other contract documents, dated <u>January 2016</u>, and prepared by County of Riverside, whose address is same as the above, from whom they may be obtained upon deposit of <u>\$10.00</u> per set with 22" x 34" plans, plus mailing costs. No refund. Prospective bidders may preview the plans, specifications and other contract documents at no charge prior to purchase at the above noted location.

Pursuant to Labor Code section 1771.1, any Contractor bidding, or subcontractor to be listed on a bid proposal subject to Public Contract Code section 4104, shall not be qualified to bid after March 1, 2015, unless currently registered and qualified to perform public works pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5. No Contractor or subcontractor may be awarded a contract or perform work on any contract for public work, after April 1, 2015, without proof of current registration with the Department of Industrial Relations pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5 to perform public works.
