BACKGROUND:

Summary

Due to the surge of voter turnout, the simultaneous conduct of a statewide signature verification of initiative petitions and increased number of candidates and ballot measures on the recently concluded June 7, 2016 Presidential Primary election, the Registrar of Voter requests a budget increase of \$1,198,776. This budget increase will be fully recovered by cost reimbursements from the State under AB 120 (\$895,143) and from local jurisdictions that added contests and measures to the June election (\$303,633).

BACKGROUND

Summary continued:

The June 2016 Presidential Primary Election was budgeted based on the June 2012 Election. The majority of the county was on a 1 card ballot for the June 2012 Election, 17.3% of voters received 2 cards and 82.7% of voters received 1 card. The June 2016 Election required a 2 card ballot for the entire county. Unfortunately the 34 candidates for United States Senator and the addition of local vacancies and ballot measures caused a 2 card ballot. Utilizing a 2 card ballot automatically increases all costs. The cost of printing the ballot goes up, the cost of postage goes up, and the amount of time to process the ballots goes up resulting in higher labor costs. In addition, the turnout for the June 2012 Election was 27.95% and the June 2016 Election was 44.31%. The higher voter turnout also means higher election costs.

Between 4/26/16 and 5/20/16 the Registrar of Voters received 10 statewide initiative petitions that required signature verification. The signature verification on all 10 petitions was completed simultaneously with the conduct of the election. Extra TAP employees and overtime were required to complete the signature verification process by 6/30/2016. The legislature recognized the additional costs to counties involved in completing signature verification at the same time as conducting a presidential election and passed AB 120. Riverside County is eligible to seek reimbursement from the state for \$895,143 of costs.

The \$1,198,776 budget adjustment will cover the additional temporary employees hired through the County's temporary assignment program (TAP), overtime, printing, and postage expenses associated with conducting the June Presidential Primary Election and completion of the statewide initiative signature verification.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The budget increase will allow for the ROV to cover the extra costs related to the statewide initiative signature verification and the June Presidential Primary Election.

SUPPLEMENTAL

Additional Fiscal Information

Seventy five percent (75%) or \$895,143 of the \$1,198,776 budget adjustment requested by ROV for increased election costs is eligible for State reimbursement under AB 120. The ROV also expects increased revenue due to the increased number of local jurisdictions that added contests and measures to the June election.
