BACKGROUND:

Summary continued:

The attached Exhibit A listed the various jurisdictions that have requested the Registrar of Voters to conduct and consolidated their elections with the November 8, 2016 presidential election. The Registrar of Voters has the resources to consolidate these elections. The Registrar of Voters will receive reimbursements from local jurisdictions for the full cost of conducting their election but will not be reimbursed for federal and state office elections. Staff recommends that the Board of Supervisors approve the conduct and consolidation of election services listed in Exhibit A for the November 8, 2016 Consolidated General Election.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Registered voters in the County of Riverside will have the opportunity to vote for several federal, state, and local offices which are all listed on the attached Exhibit A.

SUPPLEMENTAL

Additional Fiscal Information

The county will not be reimbursed for the federal and state offices that will appear on the November ballot. The local jurisdictions that have added a measure or special election to the November ballot will reimburse the Registrar of Voters for the full cost of conducting their election.
