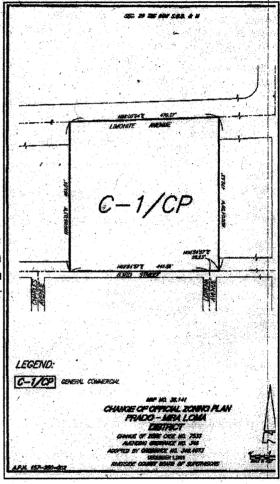

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside ordoins as follows:
Section 1. Ordinance No. 824 is omended in its entirely to read as follows:

Section 1. TITLE. This ordinance shall be known as the "Western Riverside County Transportation Uniform Mitigation Fee Program Ordinance of 2009*
('Ordinance').

Section 2.

In Ecounty, as a member agency of the Western Riverside County of Riverside and sixteen (16) cities tocated in Western Riverside County, and the County of Riverside and sixteen (16) cities tocated in Western Riverside County of Riverside County of Riverside County with the WRCOG Member Agencies to develop and update a plan whereby the shortfall in funds needed to endage the capacity of the Regional System of Highways and Arterials in Western Riverside County ('Regional System'). depicted in Exhibit "A', attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein, could be made up in part by a Transportation Uniform Mitigation Fee ("TUMF") on future residential, commercial and industrial development.

b. WRCOG prepared a certain "Western Riverside County Transportation Uniform Fee Nexus Study," dated October 18, 2002 ('2002 Nexus Study) in compliance with the Mitigation Fee Act (Gov. Code §§ 66000 et seq.); whereby the County adopted and implemented an ordinance, based on the new nexus study entitled "Transportation Uniform Mitigation Fee Nexus Study, authorizing the County's participation in the TUMF Program.

c. As a TUMF Participation, because the HUMF Program in the Study of the Regional System in a considered the 2009 Nexus Study, including its Addendum regarding temporary te

the TUMF.
The cost estimates set forth in the new 2009 Nexus Study are reasonable cost estimates for constructing the Regional System improvements and the facilities that compromise the Regional System, and that the amount of the TUMF expected to be generated by new development will not exceed the total fair share cost to such development.

development.

The impact of an economic recession on development and the construction sector in Western Riverside County, as indicated in the Addendum to the 2009 Nexus Study, has been substantial and a temporary fifty perent (50%) reduction in TUMF through December 31, 2010 will encourage economic development by reducing the overall cost of development. An adjustment of the entire TUMF Program will also assure that each development continues to contribute a fair share of the total Program costs.

A minor decrease in TUMF revenues will not have a material effect on the ability to fulfill the purposes of the TUMF Program or the ability to make the findings recited herein pursuant to the Mitigation Fee Act.

The Fees collected pursuant to this ordinance shall be used to help pay for the design, planning, construction of and real acquisition for the Regional System improvements and its facilities as identi-fied in the 2009 Nexus Study. The need for the improvements and facilities is related to new development because such development results in additional traffic and creates the demand for the

Section 3. PURPOSE. The purpose of this ordinance is to authorize the County's participation in the TUMF Program which establishes and sets forth policies, regulations, and authorized uses of fees callected relating to the funding for the construction of improvements and facilities to enlarge the capacity of the Regional System of Highways and Arterials in Western Riverside County necessary to address the direct and cumulative environmental effects generated by new development projects described and defined in this ordinance.

Section 4. AUTHORITY. This ordinance is established under the authority of Article TI, Section 7 of the California Constitution and Title 7, Division 1, Chapter 5 of the Government Code, beginning with Section 66000 et seq., which provides that a local agency may establish fees for the purpose of detraying all or a portion of the cost of public facilities related to development projects.

Section 5. DEFINITIONS. As used in this ordinance, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

a. Area Plan. The area plan as it is depicted in Exhibit "B" and noted as the unincorporated areas of Riverside County as referenced and aftached to this ordinance.

The temporary fee reduction described in this section shall not apply to ar affect fees owed under any development agreement or other confluctual arrangement in effect on or before the effective date affordinance No. 824.7. If reduced fees are paid pursuant to this Sections 7. at issuance of a building permit and either the application are building permit issued on the application expires, subsequent huilding permit issued on the application expires, subsequent huilding permit applications on the same parcel shall be subject to the full TUMF amount, unless the temporary fee reduction is still in effect at the time of the subsequent application.

b. Effect. No provision of this section shall entitle any person who has already paid the Tunnsportation Uniform Militgotion Fees to receive a refund, credit or reimbursement of such payment. This section only effects a temporary change in the County's Transportation Uniform Militgotion Fees.

c. Expiration As of December 31, 2010, this section is repealed without further action by the Board of Supervisors, unless the Board of Supervisors repeals or maddities this section prior to that date. The repeal of this section of affect the validity of actions taken or Transportation Uniform Militgotion Fees paid under the authority of this section.

Development Projects which are the subject of a Public Facilities Development Agreement Coevelopment Agreement? entered into pursuant to Government Cade section 65864 et sea, prior to the effective date of Continuance No. 824, wherein the imposition of new fees are expressly positivited provided that if the term of such a Development Agreement is extended by amendment or by any other manner after the effective date of Ordinance No. 824, the TUMF shall be imposed.
e. Guest Dwellings, as defined in Section 21.31 of Ordinance No. 348.
f. Additional single family residential units located on the same parcel pursuant to the provisions of any agricultural zoning classifications set forth in Ordinance No. 348.
g. Kennels and Culturals established in connection with an existing single family residential unit and as defined in Sections 21.40a and 21.20 of Ordinance No. 348.
h. Detached Second Units pursuant to Section 18.28a of Ordinance No. 348.

Section 9. CREGIONAL System improvements may be credited toward the TUMF in accordance with the TUMF Administrative Plan and the following:

a. Regional Tier.

1) Arferiol Credits. If a developer constructs arterial improvements identified in the Regional System, the developer shall sective credit for all costs associated with the arterial amponent based on approved the Nexus Study for the Regional System effective at the time the parties enter the credit agreement. WRCOG staff must pre-approve any credit agreements that deviate from the standard WRCOG approved format.

2) Other Credits. In special circumstances, when a developer constructs off-site improvements such as an inter-change, bridge, or railroad grade separation, credits shall be determined by WRCOG and the County in consultation with the developer. All such credits must have prior written approval by WRCOG.

3) The amount of the Fee credit shall not exceed the maximum amount determined by the 2009 Nexus Study for the Regional System at the time the credit agreement is entered sinte ar actual costs, whichever is less.

b. Local Tier.

1) The local jurisdictions shall compare facilities in local fee programs against the Regional System and eliminate any overlap in its local fee program except where there is a Recognized Financing District has been established.

established.
2) If there is a Recognized Financing District established, the local agency may credit that portion of the facility identified in bulb programs against the TUMF in accordance with the TUMF Administrative Plan.

Section 10. REIMBURSEMENTS. Should the developer may be reimbursed based on actual costs or the approved News Study, including Addendum 1. effective at the time the agreement was entered into, whichever is less. Reimbursements shall be enacted through an agreement between the developer and the County, contingent on funds being available and approved by WRCOG. In all cases, however, reimbursements under such special agreements must coincide with construction of the

transportation improvements as scheduled in the five-year Capital Improvements Program adopted annually by WRCOG.

Section 11. PROCEDURES FOR THE LEVY, COLLECTION AND DISPOSITION

a. Authority of the Building Department. The Director of Building & Safety, or his/her designee, is hereby outhorized to levy and collect the TUMF and make all determinations required by this ordinance.

b. Payment. Payment of the fees shall be as follows:

1) The fees shall be poid of the time a certificate of occupancy is issued for the Development Project or upon final inspection, whichever comes first ("Payment Otte"). However, this section should not be construed to prevent payment of the fees prior to issuance of an occupancy posmil or final inspection. Fees may be poid of the inseason of the issuance of a building permit and the fee payment shall be calculated based on the fee in effect at that time, provided the developer tenders the full amount of his/her TUMF obligation. If the developer makes only a partial payment pursuant to a WRCOG-Developer Deternal Agreement prior to the Payment Date, the amount of the fee due shall be based on the TUMF schedule in place on the Payment Date. The fees shall be calculated according to fee schedule set forth in the ordinance and the calculation methodology set forth in the Fee Calculation Handbook adopted July 14, 2003, as amended from time to time.

2) The fees required to be poid shall be the fee amounts in effect of the time of payment is due under this ordinance, not the date the ordinance is initially adopted. The County shall not enter into a development agreement which liveres future adjustments of the TUMF.

3) If all or part of any development project is sold prior to payment of the fee, the property shall continue to be subject to the requirement for payment of the fee. The obligation of Fees. e. Reports to WRCOG. The Director of Building and Safety, or his/her designee, shall prepare and deliver to the Executive Director of WRCOG, periodic repails as will be established under Section 12. of this ordinance.

Section 12.APPOINTMENT OF THE TUMF ADMINISTRATOR. WRCOG is hereby appointed as the Administrator of the Transportation Uniform Militgation Fee Program. WRCOG is hereby authorized to neceive all fees generated from the TUMF within the County, and to invest, account farend expend such tees in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance and the Militgation Fee Act. The detailed administrative procedures concerning the implementation of this ordinance shall be contained in the TUMF Administrative Plan adopted May 5, 2003 and as may be amended from time to time, for the purpose of calculating at developer's TUMF, and the purpose of calculating at developer's TUMF, beingation. Section 13. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES. A violation of any provision of this ordinance is an infraction as hereinafter specified. A person is guilty of a separate offense for each and every day or portion thereof during which any violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance is committed or continued. Any violation of this ordinance may be prosecuted by county authentities in the name of the people of the State of California, or redressed by civil action. Every violation determined to be an infraction is punishable by (1) a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$100) for a first violation. (2) a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$100) for a second violation within one year. (3) a fine not exceeding the hundred dollars (\$100) for a canditional violation within one year. The penalties herein are in addition to any other remedies provided by law and the portuent of any penalty herein shall not relieve a person of the obligation to correct the violation.

Section 14. SEVERABLITY. If any of the terms, provisions or sections of this ordinance of the application thereof to any pusson or circumstances shall to any extent be judged invalid, unenforceable analor which to an be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end, the populary or determination shall not affect the other provisions of this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end, the popularion of this ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

Section 15. JUDICIAL REVIEW. In accombance with State law, any judicial action or proceeding to attack, review, set aside, wait or annul this ordinance shall be commenced within ninety (90) days of the date of adoption of this ordinance of any development permit or entitlement made on and after the date that this ordinance takes effect. Section 13. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES. A violation of any provision of this

takes errect. Section 17. EFFECTIVE DATE. This entimance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adaption except that Section 6. subsection a.(4) shall take effect sixty (60) days after its adoption.
