BACKGROUND: (Continued)

This program is a result of changes in the tax code that went into effect during the last few years. The potential benefits to a participating business include a tax refund, improved long term cash flow, and compliance with Internal Revenue Service (IRS) codes. CALED has contracted with an industry leader in Cost Segregation Analysis to conduct the studies and receives a fee for referrals generated through CALED and its members. CALED is offering a percentage of the fee they receive to its members who refer businesses that take advantage of the program; EDA is a member of CALED and is therefore eligible. The referral fee that EDA receives would be used to fund economic development, business attraction, and retention programs. The program would be offered to cities throughout the County as part of the Team Riverside County partnership.
